## Do you have photographs of loved ones lost at war?

As part of *time to remember*, an event to mark the centenary of the first two minute silence, we are curating a photography exhibition of men and women from the local area who have died whilst serving their country. To help us achieve this we're asking you to lend a photograph.

Over the last 100 years many servicemen and women have fallen; from those who never returned from duty in the First World War to those killed in present day conflicts. We want to bring together the faces of some of these people and exhibit them in the town as part of this special event.

Time to remember is an event to mark the centenary of the first two minute silence which took place in Farnham in May 1916 before a fair and auction to raise funds for the Red Cross during WWI. On Sunday 1 May 2016 there will be a procession, performance and May Day fair on Castle Street and Gostrey Meadow 100 years on.

If you have a photograph of someone from Farnham, or connected to the local area, who died in service at any point since the outbreak of World War One, then we invite you to share this with us. Ideally these photographs will be head and shoulder images with the person in uniform.

Please bring your photographs to the box office at Farnham Maltings by **5pm**, **Wednesday 20 April**, where we'll complete a sheet with your contact details. Please also include the full name, the date of birth and date of death, and the rank and regiment of person pictured. Photographs can then be collected from the Farnham Maltings box office during May.

We will take great care of your photograph, however we cannot accept liability for loss or damage so we recommend that you also take a copy before bringing your photograph.
