I have given further thought to your email from Friday on the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Screening opinion in relation to the Farnham neighbourhood plan and discussed this with Matthew and Graham.

As I said on Friday, It was never my intention to be officious or add to the burden of work for the sake of it. Neighbourhood planning is a new area of work for all of us, and 'best practice' is still emerging. My main concern has always been to ensure that the risk of any legal challenge to the neighbourhood plans being prepared is minimised. I have seen what has happened with other neighbourhood plans, for example Loxwood and want to make sure we are covered against legal challenges, especially from aggrieved site promoters. The Loxwood neighbourhood plan was subject to a legal challenge in mid 2014 based around the failure of Chichester District Council to carry out a legally compliant screening opinion process to determine whether a SEA of the plan was required. This delayed the adoption of their neighbourhood plan by over a year whilst they held a second examination and referendum, at significant cost.

Having said that, I do accept that Farnham is in a different position, both to Loxwood and from other neighbourhood plans being prepared in Waverley. Most critically, you have already decided that SA/SEA is required and are well down the road of preparing one. There is perhaps a <u>very</u> small chance that at a later stage someone who is challenging the Neighbourhood Plan argues that an SEA is not needed and seeks to unpick the process that you went through in deciding that an SEA was needed. **However, as long as you are aware of and are happy to accept this small risk, then I am content to agree to your request not to complete a SEA screening opinion form.** As you say, we know the answers it will give and I am sure we would conclude, as you did, that SEA is required because of the SPA.

I trust you are satisfied with this conclusion. Please let me know if I can be of any further assistance.

I would suggest that the guidance you have stated is not relevant given how far progressed the Farnham NP is (new guidance is not normally retrospective). As you know, the Farnham NP is no longer at an "early stage" of preparation and since an SA/SEA will have been done, whether or not it has been screened by you to say that it did or did not need one, seems meaningless. If we were proposing not to do one, I could understand the concern.

In any case, you are obviously keen we fill out this form so I will do so as soon as possible to ensure this box in the process is ticked. I do find it disappointing that the process between us could be perceived to be somewhat officious, adding to the burden of work to be done by the towns and parishes. I am not suggesting that you shouldn't do a screening opinion, but as we both know a screening opinion is required and you have already read and commented on our Regulation 14 Draft Plan, you know the answers to all the questions that are on the form already.

Thanks for this response, which is helpful.

In my email of 22 May, I said that Waverley would request that all qualifying bodies producing a neighbourhood plan complete the SEA Screening application form, even if they have already decided SA/SEA is required and have started to prepare the Environmental Statement, as this will eliminate any risk of the neighbourhood plan being rejected at its examination because of the lack of SEA Screening. The Government guidance now says that "To decide whether a draft neighbourhood plan might have significant environmental effects, it must be assessed (screened) at an early stage of the plan's preparation".

I strongly support the fact that Farnham TC is already doing an SA/SEA/HRA for the neighbourhood plan, which I am sure is correct given the SPA issues. I would still recommend that you request a (retrospective) screening opinion from us to eliminate any risk o future challenge on these grounds, although these risks may be small. We cannot insist on this, but could you please discuss this matter further with your consultant Tony Fullwood to get his view?

There is a section on Sustainability Appraisal and Strategic Environmental Assessment. Although there is no legal requirement for a neighbourhood plan to have a sustainability appraisal (SA), a parish or town council must demonstrate how the plan will contribute to achieving sustainable development. In some

circumstances, where a neighbourhood plan is likely to have significant environmental effects, it may require a strategic environmental assessment (SEA). Some neighbourhood plans may also trigger the Habitats Directive.

In order to determine whether the neighbourhood plan is likely to have significant environmental effects, the parish or town council must, at an early stage of plan making, formally ask the Borough Council for an 'SEA screening opinion'. This is because the National Planning Practice Guidance has recently been revised, and it now states that

"To decide whether a draft neighbourhood plan might have significant environmental effects, it must be assessed (screened) at an early stage of the plan's preparation".

Also, the Neighbourhood Plan Regulations have been amended to require one of the following to be included with a submitted neighbourhood plan:

- A statement of reasons of why SEA is not required, or
- An Environmental Report.

Unless a Screening Opinion is provided, you would not be able to demonstrate why Sea is not required.

To help you understand the process, we have produced an SEA guidance note, giving more detail on what is required. We have also produced an application form which should be completed and submitted to us. To see these, click on this link. Please note that we would like you to complete and return the application form even if you have already decided that an SEA is required, or have started to prepare the Environmental Statement. This may seem unnecessary but providing you with a formal screening opinion will eliminate any risk to your plan being rejected at examination stage because it was not screened for SEA.

More information on SA and SEA is given in the Government's Planning Practice Note on the subject. There is also a section on Neighbourhood Planning.

I have given further thought to your email from Friday on the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Screening opinion in relation to the Farnham neighbourhood plan and discussed this with Matthew and Graham.

As I said on Friday, It was never my intention to be officious or add to the burden of work for the sake of it. Neighbourhood planning is a new area of work for all of us, and 'best practice' is still emerging. My main concern has always been to ensure that the risk of any legal challenge to the neighbourhood plans being prepared is minimised. I have seen what has happened with other neighbourhood plans, for example Loxwood and want to make sure we are covered against legal challenges, especially from aggrieved site promoters. The Loxwood neighbourhood plan was subject to a legal challenge in mid 2014 based around the failure of Chichester District Council to carry out a legally compliant screening opinion process to determine whether a SEA of the plan was required. This delayed the adoption of their neighbourhood plan by over a year whilst they held a second examination and referendum, at significant cost.

Having said that, I do accept that Farnham is in a different position, both to Loxwood and from other neighbourhood plans being prepared in Waverley. Most critically, you have already decided that SA/SEA is required and are well down the road of preparing one. There is perhaps a very small chance that at a later stage someone who is challenging the Neighbourhood Plan argues that an SEA is not needed and seeks to unpick the process that you went through in deciding that an SEA was needed. However, as long as you are aware of and are happy to accept this small risk, then I am content to agree to your request not to complete a SEA screening opinion form. As you say, we know the answers it will give and I am sure we would conclude, as you did, that SEA is required because of the SPA.

I trust you are satisfied with this conclusion. Please let me know if I can be of any further assistance.

In my email of 22 May, I said that Waverley would request that all qualifying bodies producing a neighbourhood plan complete the SEA Screening application form, even if they have already decided SA/SEA is required and have started to prepare the Environmental Statement, as this will eliminate any risk of the neighbourhood plan being rejected at its examination because of the lack of SEA Screening. The Government guidance now says that "To decide whether a draft neighbourhood plan might have significant environmental effects, it must be assessed (screened) at an early stage of the plan's preparation".

I strongly support the fact that Farnham TC is already doing an SA/SEA/HRA for the neighbourhood plan, which I am sure is correct given the SPA issues. I would still recommend that you request a (retrospective) screening opinion from us to eliminate any risk o future challenge on these grounds, although these risks may be small. We cannot insist on this, but could you please discuss this matter further with your consultant Tony Fullwood to get his view?

External Support

We appreciate the offer to fund the full health check of the plan, but we would prefer for our full Reg 15 plan to be assessed, prior to submission and finalisation. We saw little benefit of having issues that we are aware of being highlighted, when we have already dealt with some of the in our drafting of the next version.

With that being said, we do agree it would be helpful to have an examiner look at the Plan and advise specifically on SANG. I have discussed this with NPIERS and one of their examiners and they have agreed that it wouldn't be helpful to fully health check the entire Reg 4 Plan. It has been suggested, that an examiner be commissioned to advise solely on SANG, with reference specifically to the Farnham NDP. Clare Wright of NPIERS and the Community Spirit Partnership CIC further suggested that when the Plan is to be formally "health checked", it would take less time, as the examiner would be up to speed with the Farnham NP.

In relation to SANG we can discuss when we meet the direction the Executive has given on the way forward. I understand that the site you are considering the large tract of land to the south of Badshot Lea. This is currently marked red in the SHLAA. The challenge here is availability – I doubt that the land owners who is promoting the site would sell the site to Waverley for SANG until they have exhausted all development options through the Local Plan and planning application process. Even then the business case for taking on SANG only really works if a site is acquired at or around agricultural value which is not going to be attractive to the land owners I suspect.

In relation to the Neighbourhood Plan event – we are happy to support but until the Executive has given the steer on the spatial strategy which neighbourhood plans will need to follow, such an event will have limited value. A report is due to go to the Executive at the beginning of November. Once that has been agreed then we can make some arrangements.

Can I ask the Town Council to reconsider the offer Waverley has made in relation to the external support. Rachel has indicated that the Town Council would prefer waiting until December when the next version of the neighbourhood plan (the Regulation 15 submission) version is available. I think there would great benefit in having an earlier meeting with a neighbourhood plan examiner so that these matters can be discussed (and hopefully resolved) before the submission version is finalised. The NPIERs examiner we have been allocated has confirmed that she is available in the next few weeks. Is the TC intending to carry out further Regulation 14 consultation with neighbourhood plan before it is submitted to Waverley?

You kindly shared with us the Ascot Neighbourhood Plan which was useful insight in how to progress a neighbourhood plan in advance of the Local Plan. A few things stood out:

Helpfully the Inspector expressed the view that

"neighbourhood planning can, in the absence of relevant development plan policies, provide an excellent opportunity to introduce policies that can help provide for certainty in what might otherwise be a 'policy vacuum.' The fact that there is an emerging development plan in a local authority area is not an unusual circumstance and there is nothing in the relevant legislation to support the contention that such a situation should necessarily stop, or slow down, the progress of a neighbourhood plan."

"Neighbourhood planning polices are not examined against emerging strategic policies, but it makes good sense for neighbourhood planners to have access to up-to-date information and to be aware of likely future changes and of the evidence leading to such."

However he did note that:

".... the Neighbourhood Plan does not attempt to determine the overall quantum of houses to be built within the Neighbourhood Area during the plan period. In the absence of current, adopted policy determining housing numbers for the whole local authority area, it would be difficult to do so". And also that "Housing supply for the local authority area will be rigorously examined in the coming period and this will result in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead Local Plan setting out housing numbers and site allocations, once adopted. "

From what I understand it is the intention of the Town Council to identify a housing target. However the Examining Inspector at Ascot has identified this as challenging and I think we should take advice collectively on this matter. My concern is that if the Neighbourhood Plan wishes to be prescriptive about housing target it will quickly be out of date by a more up to date figure in the emerging Local Plan. It may be that a different approach is needed to introduce more flexibility into the Neighbourhood Plan to allow for changing circumstances.

Just want to echo Carole's thank you for yesterday – apologies that you didn't know I was coming!

After our discussion, I was looking at the Badshot Lea consortium last night and this is the FNP view: Flood zone 2 and 3a. A large site which would significantly extend development into the countryside and create a substantial extension to Badshot Lea. A smaller area comprising the northern part of this site would represent a less intrusive extension to Badshot Lea, cause less harm to the character of the countryside and is identified as a potential housing option in the Plan. The Town Council is not aware that this site currently has SANGS available to support delivery of housing. This extensive site is unsuitable and currently not achievable as a potential housing option.

Whilst I was away at the time of the meeting on the SHLAA and "FHLAA", I am not sure the two documents agreed by the end of the discussion. It might be good for a couple of people to get together again and, open-minded, look at the two documents; compare the methodologies and then we can understand each other's criteria better, hopefully so we can start to come to the same conclusions. If both documents are objective, I don't see why this can't be the case.

Dear all,

As a town or parish council that is preparing a neighbourhood plan, I wanted to let you know that the Government has made some amendments to national guidance in the Planning Practice Guidance on Neighbourhood Planning.

- Para 040 now has an extra three sentences that essentially say that where relevant,
 Neighbourhood Plans must take account of the latest evidence of housing need. As you know,
 the most recent Strategic Housing Market Assessment (SHMA) identified a need for 519 homes
 per annum in Waverley.
- Para 015 has a change that relates to the Governance arrangements for town and parish councils
 preparing neighbourhood plans, such as establishing sub committees.
- Para 009 includes two changes:
 - Firstly it adds the following; "For example, up-to-date housing needs evidence is relevant to the question of whether a housing supply policy in a neighbourhood plan or Order contributes to the achievement of sustainable development." This is a similar point as the change to para 040.
 - It also adds "Neighbourhood plans should consider providing indicative delivery timetables, and allocating reserve sites to ensure that emerging evidence of housing need is addressed. This can help minimise potential conflicts and ensure that policies in the neighbourhood plan are not overridden by a new Local Plan."

This final point is particularly relevant in the Waverley context, as a new Local Plan is in the process of being prepared which is likely to allocate a number of homes to be delivered in each of the settlements (other than very small villages) over the period to 2032. The Local Plan is expected to be submitted for its examination this year and it could be adopted shortly after some of your neighbourhood plans are 'made'. Allocating reserve sites as suggested would help to ensure that the neighbourhood plan is more flexible and has a longer shelf life.

Your dedicated Waverley policy officer (Matthew Ellis, Gareth Williams, Jennie Falconer or myself) would be very happy to discuss this new guidance with you or to provide further advice on the latest information on housing needs.

Neighbourhood plans are an important part of the plan-led system. The Government's policy intention when introducing neighbourhood planning was to provide a powerful set of tools for local people to ensure they get the right types of development for their community, while also planning positively to support strategic development needs.

Decision makers may find themselves considering applications in an area with a neighbourhood plan that has passed referendum and been "made", and thus forms part of the development plan, but where the local planning authority cannot demonstrate a five-year supply of deliverable housing sites.

In such instances paragraph 49 of the Framework is clear that "relevant policies for the supply of housing should not be considered up-to-date if the local planning authority cannot demonstrate a five-year supply of deliverable housing sites." Paragraph 49 applies to policies in the statutory development plan

documents which have been adopted or approved in relation to a local planning authority area. It also applies to policies in made neighbourhood plans.

Where the development plan is absent, silent or the relevant policies are out of date, paragraph 14 of the Framework states that the presumption in favour of sustainable development requires the granting of planning permission, unless any adverse impacts of doing so would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the benefits, when assessed against the policies in the Framework taken as a whole; or specific policies in the Framework indicate development should be restricted.

In this situation, when assessing the adverse impacts of the proposal against the policies in the Framework as a whole, decision makers should include within their assessment those policies in the Framework that deal with neighbourhood planning.

This includes paragraphs 183–185 of the Framework; and paragraph 198 which states that where a planning application conflicts with a neighbourhood plan that has been brought into force, planning permission should not normally be granted.

Dear Paul,

As agreed at our recent meeting with you, FTC's Infrastructure Group have reviewed the draft IPD and wish to propose some changes to the report and to the infrastructure schemes listed. We are grateful for this opportunity to be able to provide this input.

As background, we have again provided you with our 'Developing our Community' document. This has been formally agreed by the Council and was based on the outcomes of extensive consultation with residents and businesses in the town.

Also attached is an annotated version of the proposed list of infrastructure projects provided in the report for Farnham. This includes both comments on these proposed schemes (blue highlighted) and some additional proposals (yellow highlighted).

Comments on the main text of the IPD, which should be considered alongside the FTC comments for the WBC Core Strategy consultation, recently agreed by the Town Council, are as follows:

Page 5. Infrastructure must come before housing. The housing delivery scheduled on page 5 should start with smaller numbers and get bigger, rather than the reverse as shown. To do otherwise will add to local problems.

Page 5. Refer to the FTC Core Strategy response, which strongly suggests that provision of housing in Waverley should be allocated more towards locations such as Dunsfold, which can provide brown field sites. In Farnham, we do not have enough brownfield space.

Page 5. Cross border issues, again referred to in FTC's core strategy response, need to be clearly reflected in the IPD.

Page 5. Unlike Farnham, nearby districts such as Hart, East Hants and Rushmoor have the benefit of readily available, large and often exmilitary brownfield sites. Farnham does not have enough brownfield areas to cope with proposed 757 new houses in 2011-16, so greenfield sites would have to be used. This will also have unacceptable effects on Farnham's over-strained infrastructure. The IDP needs to avoid using similar housing targets for every area,

despite varying availability of suitable building land away from green sites. This is a particular problem in Farnham.

- Page 6. During successive development programmes, necessary infrastructure investments have not been made in Farnham, which has led to an infrastructure backlog. This has been largely ignored in the IDP. As stated on page 6, S106 agreements and CILs will only pay for infrastructure needs of new development. The report needs to address the existing infrastructure backlog in Farnham.
- Page 7. Farnham's population is stated in the 2010 mid-year estimates as 39,147. The 2011 Census figures have not yet been released, but could show it as already over 40,000.
- Page 8. The IDP says that Waverley needs 4 extra forms at Primary Level and 4-5 at Secondary Level. If forms are taken to mean classrooms for 30 pupils, it is unlikely that five forms of 30 pupils (150 places) will be sufficient to accommodate the children of an increasing population of say 40,000, of whom about 10% (4,000) will be at school age.
- Page 19. Road infrastructure is already one of the most neglected areas in Farnham, and its shortcomings will be exacerbated by increasing vehicle ownership and usage, alongside increased numbers of residents. The National Transport Model suggests a likely overall increase of about 22% between 2011 and 2027. Car numbers are expected to increase even more. Surrey has car ownership that is already 52% above the national average, with Farnham one of the wealthier towns with more car ownership. This indicates that the increase of traffic could be well be even in excess of that shown by the National Transport Model.
- Page 19. Why no mention of B3001 as this is the main Farnham access to Godalming and is often used as alternative route to the A3?
- Page 19. It is suggested heavy traffic on the Frensham Road travelling towards Farnham should not be allowed to turn right into Great Austins. Similarly heavy traffic travelling down Shortheath Road should not be allowed to cross the lights into Great Austins. Instead, heavy traffic should follow the Frensham Road and cross the railway bridge before turning right into station approach. This will avoid the level crossing. As a result Great Austins could become a residential road

- again, the level crossing will have the traffic crossing reduced and also there would be less of a pinch-neck with Waverley Lane.
- Page 17. The statement on Page 17 that the Highway Agency has not identified any future requirements shows a unwillingness to address the problems of the future!
- Page 19. We need to use 'heavy load' restrictions more to avoid heavy traffic using short cuts. One example is Camp Hill where there are no lights, no pavements, the road is very narrow and there are two listed cottages. Another bigger example is Crooksbury Road. Waverley Lane may be an A road but heavy goods vehicles should be banned there, as this is a narrow country lane, with two schools and a hospice.
- Page 19. Since Farnham Railway Station will also probably be the starting point for movements to and from London for residents in the new Bordon Eco-town, there can be no doubt that the road traffic into Farnham will increase. Although Bordon has proposed some ambitious traffic management schemes, the overall mitigation of the possible load on Farnham has yet to be tested against reality.
- Pages 24/25. Trains are very crowded at commuter times, and it is difficult to increase capacity because bridges will not permit twin-level carriages. Recent usage has increased at 6.36% per year, and there is no reason why the rate of increase will not continue.
- Page 28. Buses are insufficient, which is partly because they do not cover the whole of Farnham. Also they are not linked to commuter times, which start earlier and finish later than normal bus services.
- Page 29. The core strategy looks to reduce car usage by public transport (buses), walking and cycling. This can only be achieved if housing is well served by bus routes with stops near groups of houses, and perhaps more cycle lanes. However, Farnham is not flat, as in the Wey valley. Young mothers with children and the elderly cannot be expected to walk or cycle up roads such as Crondall Lane, Castle Street, Waverley Lane and Firgrove Hill with bags of shopping.
- Page 30. Few community transport schemes exist because they rely too much on volunteers. It is the system is to work, more of a subsidy is needed. The point made about the increase in the elderly population exacerbating the problem is agreed.

- Page 32. There is a lot of difference between recreational cycling and walking, which are long distance, and domestic cycling to schools, shops and services. Distances can extend to around 2km from the outer housing settlements to the town centre.
- Page 34. Pedestrians do not cause the traffic jams. There should be no need for a pedestrian bridge at the A31 but the lights need to be timed to give Station Hill more movement.
- Page 34 Pedestrians should be able to walk across the A31. Foot bridges which can accommodate disabled people, those with baby buggies and those on small mobility vehicle who can only use foot bridges with ramps, would take up large amounts of space. The A31 needs to be made more 'Farnham friendly'.
- Page 37. Electricity demand can be reduced by efficiency measures such as insulation and reduction of wastage, but reduction through price increases should not be part of the Borough Strategy. For those in limited budgets, this would lead to increasing discomfort.
- Page 41. Water companies require a three to five year lead time to provide extra capacity, as for other services. This is why development targets which are highly front-loaded do not make sense, and add to infrastructure problems.
- Page 45. Waste water and sewage treatment capacity is currently stretched in Farnham due to the failure of Thames Water to increase the capacity of the sewage treatment plant. Large scale improvements to capacity are needed to cope with 25% extra residents, which may take longer than the lead time mentioned above.
- Page 46. The assertion that the current capacity is sufficient needs to be re-examined. It is difficult to understand why Thames Water cannot plan more than 5 years ahead, as stated on page 47, given that the development programme provides annual information on population and housing numbers out to 2026.
- Page 51. It is unlikely that waste from increased housing will be compensated by increased efficiency, unless there is a change in the regulations for food and goods packaging.

Pages 64 onwards. We have a number of comments relating to the Green Infrastructure section:

- You cannot create green infrastructure while removing green spaces for development. It is not understood how development of housing will create a contribution to green infrastructure, and the Plan gives no ideas as to how this will be achieved. Improvements should be made in existing green areas by promoting tree planting, especially by planting trees producing food for birds.
- We have concerns in that Surrey Wildlife Trust admits that current measures to maintain and enhance the biodiversity of the local area are not working. There is a continued loss of species. The network of sites is needs to be made to work and the frequent destruction and fragmentation of habitats avoided.
- In the Government response to the "Making Space for Nature" review, there are several recommendations for local authorities and others. The four keywords, to improve the provision of effective green spaces are: more, bigger, better and joined. WBC has a duty to map the components of ecological networks in the borough.
- Planning policy and practice should provide the strongest protection to internationally important sites, such as the Thames Basin Heaths and Wealden Heaths SPAs, as well as to local SSSIs, such as Moor Park and Gong Hill. Development near these sites must be strictly controlled. Waverley has a duty to protect these special areas.
- The RSPB's heath-land restoration project at Farnham Heath is designed to support the rare species found in the local SSSIs, such as sand lizards and woodlarks. It is essential that the semirural linkage to the south of the town, created by low density townscape, broken up by patches of woodland, green spaces, large gardens and a network of streams and footpaths is maintained, to sustain these important wildlife populations.
- It is essential that green open spaces, which are currently protected by local policy but which lie beyond the Green Belt, continue to enjoy protection, to preserve the natural link to the countryside.

- It is also recommended that LPAs create and retain space for wildlife along river corridors. It is vital that the river Wey, a chalk stream in the Farnham area, which has been defined as a priority habitat, is protected from development of any kind. It is a vital link between habitats in an increasingly fragmented landscape.
- There is a duty for LPAs to reconnect people with nature by enhancing ecological networks in towns. This can only be done in Farnham by respecting the SPAs properly and by preserving smaller green spaces, such as churchyards, allotments, cemeteries, parks, playing-fields and gardens. The town is currently in the process of collecting information on the green areas, which are of importance to the community, to be included in its Neighbourhood Plan. Farnham has been historically blessed with many open green spaces and these must be protected in the future, to retain the special character of the town.
- Gardens must also be protected, where they form natural links to the green spaces on the outskirts of the town. More detailed landscaping conditions should be applied, to ensure that there is no further loss of trees or hedgerows and a range of species should be demanded. More planting of street trees should also be encouraged.
- There is a real fear that the use of Farnham Park as a SANGS has already resulted in the loss of too much of its semi-wild character. No more suburbanising alterations should be permitted in this ancient park.
- At present, traffic entering the town at the Shepherd and Flock roundabout does so at 70mph. This is excessive. The slowing down of traffic and greening along the A31 between the Shepherd and Flock and Coxbridge roundabouts would not only bring advantages to the town's residents but would also make it easier for wildlife to migrate.
- Landfill sites, such as the SITA site in Runfold and the Farnham Quarry site, provide valuable opportunities to increase and enhance biodiversity. The plan should recognize that the Farnham Quarry site is intended become a Wetlands Nature Reserve, run by the Blackwater Valley Management Trust and

that the SITA site needs to be restored by 2021. A committee has been established to design and execute the restoration of the site and, on completion, it is expected there will be a mix of green space, trees and hedgerows. It will be managed by SITA until 2050 but needs to become a wildlife corridor over this period.

Page 69. The Thames Basin Heaths SPA Avoidance Strategy is a key issue. The mitigation of the effects of housing within the buffer zone include reducing the number of houses to be built in that area, in line with the EU directive.

Page 71 There is considerable doubt that the SANGs are effective in attracting residents for dog-walking.

Page 74. Flood Infrastructure. Farnham is at risk from flooding by the River Wey, and instances have occurred in which building has been permitted in areas liable to flooding. This has mainly been due to accepting the assessments made by consultants hired by developers, and a refusal by the Environmental Agency to accept photographic evidence to the contrary.

From Design Statement to Neighbourhood Plan Infrastructure constraints on future development in Farnham

Foreword

In both Waverley's current Local Plan and the government's new Planning Policy Framework the need for sustainable development is emphasised. Both documents also seek to protect the environment for future generations and to preserve the individual character of local areas.

It is important that the meaning of sustainable development is clear. Farnham is a most attractive place to live but, with increasing population, come increasing pressures on the fragile infrastructure of a small market town. The road system is inadequate for existing traffic levels and both rail and bus services are limited. Air pollution is already above permitted levels, the sewerage system cannot cope with increased demand and there is a shortage of school places at all levels.

If sustainability assumes that car usage will be limited by appropriate development, the infrastructure has to be in place, to minimise the need for people to travel by car. At present, there is no alternative in Farnham. Rail commuters to London and elsewhere need to travel to the station by car, as there are no evening buses and thousands of workers drive between neighbouring boroughs on a daily basis. As all these centres expand, congestion and air pollution will increase. Shortage of school places in the town adds to the current congestion, as parents are forced to drive longer distances, to access a school place for their child.

Farnham occupies a unique place in both history and geography. The historic town is surrounded by Hampshire and any development in Aldershot, Farnborough and Bordon will have a great impact on the town's local roads, schools and medical facilities. Development in Farnham, whether commercial or residential, must take into account what is happening across the border.

Farnham is surrounded by open countryside and contains many green spaces but much of this countryside will lose its protection under the new planning policy framework. Countryside beyond the green belt will be under threat from development, until Waverley's new Local Plan is in place and the natural transition from countryside to town centre will be lost forever.

These green areas add to the character of the town and are vital to the well-being of wildlife and residents. Despite the pressure for development, Farnham has retained its special character and it is important that we enhance the biodiversity within and around the town for future generations to experience. Open countryside, large gardens, woodland, streams and footpaths are all part of the green network, which must be preserved, to minimise the impact on climate change and improve the environment for all.

The Special Protection Areas, which surround the town, are an essential feature of that green network. Both the Thames Basin Heaths and the Wealden Heaths provide important habitats for threatened species. Both heaths are protected by the European Birds and Habitats Directive and it would be not only irresponsible but also unlawful to destroy such special places and to deny future generations the chance to see the varied wildlife, which we have been privileged to enjoy.

Introduction

This document has been produced after consultation with residents' associations, businesses, local developers and conservation groups across the town and in neighbouring boroughs. After a series of workshops and other meetings, a draft went out to consultation for further comment. The views of all the organisations and their members are represented as fairly as possible, together with those of individual members of the public. This is in line with current government thinking, which seeks to give a greater say on planning for the future to local communities. It is part of the process, which will lead to the development of a full Neighbourhood Plan for the town and its surrounding villages.

In 2010 the residents of Farnham produced a Farnham Design Statement, which listed the following aims:

- To develop guidelines, which will have a positive influence on the town
- To represent the views of local residents about future development in the areas in which they live
- To raise awareness of the important features of the town and its surrounding villages and countryside
- To conserve the best of the architecture, by ensuring that any new development respects and complements the area's character
- To ensure a sustainable and attractive environment for future generations
- To assist developers and architects in providing developments, which are appropriate to Farnham

This document follows the guidance in the new draft framework for planning policy, which seeks to allow local authorities to produce their own plans, in order to reflect the distinctive needs and priorities of each area. It also follows the main aim in the Localism Bill, which seeks to allow local communities to influence the future of the places in which they live. Residents welcome development in the town but they wish that development to be sensitive to the town's nature and history. New development must be readily absorbed into the town, without damage to its essential character and structure.

Waverley Borough Council policy background

The main policies in the current Local Plan are designed to deliver the keynote policy:

"The council, through the Local Plan, will seek to help maintain and improve the quality of life in Waverley without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs and to enjoy a high quality environment. This means protecting and enhancing the borough's environmental quality and providing for homes, jobs, infrastructure and services, without undermining the value of built, natural and man-managed environmental resources."

The plan also states in its foreword that it:

"aims to make the best use of previously developed land within urban areas. The Plan seeks to ensure that the design of new development is of a high quality that contributes to the special and distinctive character of our towns and villages."

Farnham is one of the main settlements defined in the Waverley Draft Settlement Hierarchy. The distinctive character of the town, from the "network of passages that link the historic core" to the "wooded hills to the north and south of the town" is described in detail. Paragraph 5.9 is of particular importance:

"open spaces such as the water meadows and other more formal green spaces give the town a spacious setting. To the south of the town are several low-density residential areas, which have been protected since 1974. The preservation of the character of these areas has proved successful for over 25 years and, in consequence, this residential part of the town has retained an unusually semi-rural appearance, despite ongoing pressure for development."

In Appendix C on environmental designations, there is a heading at C.43 "Protecting the Character of the Built-Up Areas." Among three listed residential areas, which warrant special protection, is Great Austins Conservation Area and among four Areas of Special Environmental Quality is South Farnham. The character of these areas will be preserved only by rigorous defence of local policies.

National Guidance

The government has recently amended Planning Policy Statement (PPS)3 (Housing).

- Private residential gardens are now excluded from the definition of previously developed land.
- The Inspectorate has issued guidance to its officers, stating clearly that parks, private residential gardens, recreation grounds and allotments are all removed from the definition of previously developed land.

Other boroughs have issued guidance to say that this ruling means that this type of residential development will now be contrary to their Local Plan in certain areas **but Waverley Borough Council has not done so.**

- Residents and developers in Farnham complain that local policy H4, taken in conjunction with density levels, can produce inappropriate patterns of development on certain sites.
- Small blocks of flats have been built, when family homes would be more in keeping with the surrounding properties. Site-specific developments would deliver a better balance of properties in correct areas, as recommended at paragraph 109 in the Draft National Planning Policy Framework.

Cross-Border Development – planning strategically across local boundaries

Government guidelines in the Draft National Planning Policy Framework (DNPPF) state very clearly that there must be cross border co-operation. Farnham is surrounded on three sides by Hampshire. Aldershot, Farnborough, Fleet, and Alton are all nearer

neighbours than either Godalming or Haslemere. It is quicker by car to drive to settlements in East Hampshire or Rushmoor than to visit Godalming, Haslemere or Cranleigh in Waverley.

It is essential that Waverley takes into account the current and future development plans of towns in neighbouring boroughs, when planning the future development of Farnham.

Rushmoor Borough Council

In Aldershot

- 200 homes under construction,
- 500 more planned, including 200-300 additional new homes in North Town
- 4,500 in the Aldershot Urban Extension.

In Farnborough

- 920 homes under construction (376 at Farnborough Business Park and 399 at Queensgate)
- A further 330 homes are planned.

In all, the provision is for 6,350 net new dwellings in the borough of Rushmoor up to 2027. The centre of Aldershot is three miles away from the centre of Farnham and Farnborough is just six miles away.

Plus

- 164,000 square metres of new employment space
- 23,600 square metres of retail space up to 2019
- Probability of a further 56,400 metres of retail space by 2027.

Permission has already been given and work has begun on the Westgate Scheme in Aldershot, a mixed use development with a large foodstore, cinema, hotel, retail units and a small amount of housing.

Hart District Council

Hart is planning:

- 4840 homes up to 2028.
- The large developments at Fleet and Church Crookham (1040 dwellings) and the Queen Elizabeth Barracks (872 dwellings) will have an impact on Farnham's infrastructure. Cross-border commuting will increase.

Hart's policy on employment land:

"There is already to be significant development within centres that immediately surround Hart, including major business development at Farnborough Business Park and also in Basingstoke and evidence indicates that Hart has a surplus of employment space."

In Hart's policy on Town, District and Local Centres, it is clearly stated that, "The aim is for Hart's centres to complement, not compete with, each other and neighbouring centres."

Hart's spatial strategy does not identify any new areas for office or industrial uses. This cross-border approach has to be applied in Waverley, if Farnham is to succeed. It cannot and should not compete with its neighbours but should seek to complement development just over the borders.

East Hants District Council

- The Whitehill/Bordon Eco-town is the only cross-border development mentioned in Waverley's draft core strategy but its effect will be no greater than that from development in Rushmoor and Hart.
- It makes provision for 5,500 homes and 7,000 jobs. It is stated that the use of the motor-car will be discouraged but offers nothing more than a promise to provide "communication links" both within the town and to other destinations.
- There are no plans to upgrade any of the main road links between Surrey and Hampshire.
- The A3 will be promoted to potential investors as the strategic route that serves the community of the new town but there are no plans to upgrade the A325, already congested as it enters Farnham.
- Hampshire County Council has objected to Waverley's Core Strategy on the grounds that the A31, which bisects Farnham, will not be able to cope with increased traffic.

Protecting and enhancing the environment

Farnham is surrounded by open green space and contains many important areas of green space within its boundaries. Much of the green space around the town is "Countryside beyond the Green Belt", which is currently protected by local policy C2. This protection will not continue, when the DNPPF becomes law, if there is no new Local Plan in place, as is the case in Waverley. Residents are actively seeking to conserve all the town's green areas for future generations, as advised in the new framework.

- Areas of countryside beyond the green belt extend into Farnham and it is vital that
 development in these areas is strictly controlled, in order to retain the natural transition
 from open countryside to built-up area.
- The Green Belt, Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) will continue to enjoy protection under the new framework
- Areas of Great Landscape Value (AGLV), Areas of Strategic Visual Importance (ASVI) and Areas of Special Environmental Quality (ASEQ) are under threat. Residents feel that these local designations should be retained and strengthened to protect the distinctive character of the areas on the fringes of the town and to prevent the coalescence of settlements.

- In the new guidance in PPS3, private residential gardens are removed from the definition of previously developed land, as are parks, recreation grounds and allotments. Waverley Borough Council is urged to strengthen its guidance on this policy change, to afford greater protection in the future.
- The Aldershot/Farnham Strategic Gap is a special area and is currently protected by local policy C4. Retention of this open space will assume greater significance as the intensification of development in the built-up areas on both sides of the local border continues to increase.
- Limited development in the villages near Farnham would be of benefit. Villages also need to thrive and there are villages, which have seen no development over the last ten years.
- Redundant sites should be used for housing, where possible, if there is a local need.

Maintaining and enhancing biodiversity in Farnham

Farnham occupies a unique position at the western end of the Weald of Kent, Sussex and Surrey. Habitats range from sandy heath-land to chalk grassland and from ancient woodland to flood meadows of the river Wey. The boundary of the Surrey Hills AONB runs through south Farnham, there are two SSSIs and the river Wey is a designated chalk stream. Development in the town has been influenced by the Thames Basin Heaths SPA (Special Protection Area) and will be influenced by the Wealden Heaths SPA. Farnham is surrounded by areas of Biodiversity Opportunity and the river Wey is a Biodiversity Opportunity Area in its own right.

However, a single narrow corridor will not meet the complex needs of the range of wildlife present in this area. There needs to be a network of open spaces, a green infrastructure, which complements the necessary human infrastructure.

This infrastructure exists in the built-up area of Farnham, with playing-fields, school grounds, residential gardens and footpaths. It contributes to the well-being of the residents of the town and connects children with nature. This green infrastructure must be preserved.

In common with other parts of the country, the effects of climate change are being seen across Farnham. There have been changes in the patterns of behaviour of both flora and fauna, as well as the arrival of new species and the decline of others.

It is essential that Waverley works closely with Surrey Wildlife Trust and other agencies to ensure that the necessary independent environmental surveys take place, before permissions are granted and that any conditions are upheld.

Trees, woodlands and hedgerows all add to the beauty and biodiversity within and around the town. Residents seek to resist the loss of any of these features, especially where they make a significant contribution to the landscape or streetscape, especially in the town's Conservation Areas or where they are essential for wildlife.

There should be much greater protection for trees in the Conservation Areas. Planning application forms should be standardised, to enable Waverley officers to assess all the trees on each site accurately. Stricter enforcement will be necessary, as development increases and the threat to trees and hedgerows grows.

The Special Protection Areas (SPA)

Heath-land is safeguarded by a European Directive, which cannot be ignored. Farnham has the Thames Basins Heaths (TBH) to the North and the Wealden Heath to the South. **Both enjoy European Special Protection Area status.**

- The Thames Basin Heaths Special Protection Area lies to the north of Farnham and affects any new homes built within 5km. Farnham Park has been put forward by Waverley Borough Council as a suitable SANGS but Natural England admits there is no evidence that SANGS (Suitable Alternative Natural Green Space) work.
- The provision of mitigation or avoidance is the responsibility of the developer. There has never been any public assent to the proposition that Waverley Borough Council should assist developers to build within the 5km zone of the SPA by providing SANGS nor is there any legal necessity so to do.
- Guidance was very clear in NRM6 that priority should be given to directing development to those areas where potential adverse effects can be avoided without the need for mitigation measures.
- The South East Panel Report (August 2007), paragraph 26.85, allocated WBC 5,000 houses for the plan period on the assumption that all the 5,000 houses "could be provided outside the 5km zone of the TBH."
- In November 2006 at the Examination in Public of the last core strategy, the Inspector made the same point and held that "there does not appear to have been any proper evaluation of development options, which might have reduced the effects which gave rise to the need for mitigation in the first place."

The pressure on the SPAs is increasing and paragraph 170 of the DNPPF states clearly that development likely to have a significant effect on sites protected under the Birds and Habitats Directive would not be sustainable under the terms of the presumption in favour of sustainable development. The Wealden Heaths SPA lies to the south of the town and will be equally affected by large-scale development in south Farnham. For all these reasons it must be accepted that development within 5k of the Thames Basin Heath Spa and Wealden Heaths SPA must be limited and the cumulative effect of successive development must be closely monitored.

Air pollution

It is widely accepted that Farnham is an attractive historic town, blighted by the volume of traffic, which passes into and through the town centre, using a road system unsuited to the needs of today. Noise and fumes are both unpleasant and harmful to health and the town centre has long been designated as an Air Quality Management Area by Waverley Borough Council. Despite this, there has been no remedial action by Surrey County Council.

- Nitrogen dioxide levels in Farnham town centre are unacceptably high.
- Air quality readings are at dangerous levels 23% higher than the maximum set by the EU.
- Traffic is the primary cause of air pollution and further development will increase the density of traffic.
- For the first time recently, a large-scale application was refused on the basis of air quality.
- Air pollution levels in The Borough, Downing Street, Dogflud Way, Hickleys Corner and Station Hill are subject to an on-going DEFRA report.

Air quality issues must be a major consideration, when considering future development in the town centre and beyond. New development must continue to be restricted, where it would have an adverse effect on air quality.

Sewage Treatment Works

All of the sewage and waste water of Farnham and its settlements is treated at the Farnham Sewage Treatment Works, situated in Monkton Lane. For over twenty years now, near neighbours have complained about the smell from the process. However, over the past 5-7 years, the smell has become so bad that it has seriously affected the quality of life of many, who live within a mile of the works and who have cause to travel or work nearby (including Sainsbury Water Lane).

Local residents are unable to open their windows or doors and children are unable to play in the garden. The smell invades residents' homes and permeates clothes, washing, carpets, and curtains – it even permeates their wall-paper.

The plant is the responsibility of Thames Water. About two years ago, as the process was causing so much distress, a committee was formed of local residents and councillors to put pressure on Thames Water to take remedial action. After a battle Thames Water invested £700k in plant improvements. The plant was in a poor state and, even after the work was completed, the smell was just as bad. Further work was carried out on the removal of the sludge cake and there has been an improvement generally with the occasional breakdown causing a return to the production of serious odours.

The capacity of the sewage treatment works according to Thames Water is 37,000 people – that figure must include those that work in Farnham but live elsewhere as well as local residents. The plant is therefore running at full capacity and further major development would lead to a serious breakdown. None of the recent investment was designed to increase the capacity.

To increase the capacity of the plant will require a major rebuild and the cost would be many millions of pounds. Whilst the land is available, the funding is not. This is a serious infrastructure deficiency, which could lead to health problems.

Traffic

Farnham's traffic system is notoriously inadequate. The town centre is crossed by two 'A' roads and many of the town's roads are very narrow. There is an outdated one-way system in the town and frequent gridlock. The residential roads are subject to 'rat running'.

- Car ownership level in Farnham is one of the highest in the country and has increased by 15% over the last 5 years due to development since 2007
- The level crossing, when closed, causes substantial delays to traffic both north and south. For about 18 hours of the day, the gates are closed for a minimum of 14 minutes every hour. This equates to a 25% road closure.
- Particularly critical is the rapid build-up of traffic northwards to Hickley's Corner, causing queuing on the A31 and blocking road access to the station itself and on the Approach Road, which is also a bus route. This is particularly so at peak periods and any increase in frequency of service will worsen this problem.
- Restrictions on traffic, caused by the railway bridge on the A325 at Wrecclesham, result
 in heavy vehicles being routed through residential roads and over the level crossing,
 adding to the congestion.
- Inadequate car parking at the station, linked to current charging practices, leads to extensive on-street parking in residential areas south of the station, which results in inconvenience for residents, affects traffic flow and causes deterioration of the local environment. There are three schools close by, together with a hospice, which has a regional training facility and advanced proposals for a nursing-home with 54 beds.

Rushmoor Borough Council states quite clearly that modelling has indicated that, if existing car usage trends continue in the borough and only planned investment in the motorway network is completed, then by 2026 the M3 to the north of the borough will not be able to cope with demand. It also states that there is a mismatch between types of jobs and housing supply in Farnborough, which results in high levels of in/out commuting. Current figures show that 23,700 residents travel out of Rushmoor to work and 26,500 travel in. Many of these use the infrastructure in and surrounding Farnham.

Growth in Farnham, itself and in neighbouring boroughs means that current problems will only become more acute. Residents wish to see HGVs re-routed away from the town centre and it is widely believed that a Western by-pass is the only long-term solution to the traffic problems in the town, which increase with every new dwelling. Upper Hale Road is the only relief from the town centre to the north and north-west and cannot cope with existing traffic levels at peak times. Residents also continue to lobby for a Wrecclesham by-pass, to alleviate the congestion on the A325, as traffic passes through the village, before entering the town or joining the A31. As stated earlier, Hampshire County Council has objected to Waverley's Core Strategy on the grounds that the A31 will not be able to cope with the increase in traffic.

Public Transport

There remains a significant proportion of the population, which is reliant on public transport. The local bus network in Farnham currently meets only basic needs. Many areas of Farnham do not have an evening or a Sunday bus service and many bus-stops are too far away from residential roads to be accessible to the elderly or those with a mobility problem.

- The only services, which operate in the evenings or on Sundays are route 5 (Farnham to Aldershot) and route 18 (Aldershot to Whitehill, via Farnham).
- There is no reliable alternative to the car in vast areas of the town and it would be irresponsible to describe the existing bus service as adequate for future sustainable development.
- Farnham's station, with its half-hourly service to London Waterloo is a significant factor in the town's attraction as a place to live but the service is slow (58 mins) compared to Farnborough (37 mins) and Haslemere, with its non-stop trains.

Employment and Economic Development

There is a need to carry out a thorough review of employment land in the town, in order to comply with the guidance at paragraph 75 of the DNPPF. Farnham has several areas of land, which were used for industrial purposes but which have now become unsuitable, mainly due to their size or town-centre location. There is currently a large quantity of empty office space.

- It is important that Farnham defines what sort of employment it will be able to provide, bearing in mind the provision in Aldershot (mainly retail and industrial) and Farnborough (mainly high-tech industries). Employment in Farnham should complement this provision, not compete with it.
- Much employment in Farnham is related to art and design. The town is a main campus for the University for the Creative Arts and there will be increasing opportunities for business related to the university in the future, as the student body increases.
- Local companies employ an average of 15 people and the town is better suited to this small-scale pattern of employment than towns in the neighbouring boroughs.
- Locating employment on sites with easy access to the A31, such as the Coxbridge Estate
 or on land adjacent to the Farnham Trading Estate could free up much previously
 developed land along the Guildford Road, which would lend itself to residential
 development.
- Modern accommodation is needed to replace outdated employment space, in order to attract successful companies.
- Redundant office space above shops in the town centre could be brought back into use as habitable accommodation.

Communications Infrastructure

Farnham suffers with regard to provision of broadband and other high-speed data and voice lines, due to the mixed nature of the infrastructure and the age of certain installations.

- BT is the only fixed-line provider with coverage across the whole town. However, large
 parts of the area rely on ageing overhead lines, which can carry only relatively low-speed
 broadband, regardless of the speed available to the local cabinet. BT appears to have no
 immediate plans to upgrade these lines and the Surrey Superfast Broadband initiative has
 no specific plans to address this in the near future.
- Virgin provides significantly better fixed-line broadband connections. However its network covers only the northernmost parts of the area and does not cover the town centre or to the south.
- Alternatives to fixed-line services have not been taken up widely in Farnham and its surrounding villages but could provide a solution in some circumstances.
- Ready access to high-speed fixed-line broadband should be a key consideration, when
 planning new developments for business and domestic use in the town. Many people run
 small businesses from home and there is a move towards flexible working across all
 sectors. At present, businesses in the town are struggling to compete with neighbouring
 businesses across the border in Rushmoor or Guildford.

Farnham is a most attractive town, surrounded by beautiful countryside. Much wealth is made by residents outside of the town and villages and many wealth earners aspire to live in Farnham. Commercial development is essential for a balanced community but the type and location of business accommodation must be carefully assessed. Provision of very high-speed, reliable voice and data communications should be a major consideration, when planning developments in the town.

Education

Both primary and secondary schools in Farnham are filled or over capacity. This is the result of uncontrolled development since April 2007, when the Avoidance Strategy to the European Directive EC/79/409 was introduced and the failure to provide more school capacity to match the scale of development. There is a shortage of places at every level and parents are not being offered places at the schools of their choice.

Problems exist at primary school level. There are seven primary schools in Farnham and four infant schools, which feed into the primary schools:

- Schools in north Farnham are coping with the current situation and only over-subscribed by 0. 21% against the PAN (Published Admission Numbers). To achieve this, Potters Gate is to be provided with extra temporary 30-pupil classrooms in 2011 and 2012.
- In south Farnham, the problems are greater. St. Andrew's is over-subscribed by 50% with no room to expand. The Bourne School has now amalgamated with South Farnham School and is over-subscribed as a school of first choice by 100% and by 265% at all preference levels, despite the addition of two temporary classrooms. There is no room for further expansion.
- St. Peter's Primary School is over-subscribed by 90% at first choice and by 283% at all preferences. It is now a two-form entry school, with no plans for the provision of further reception classes at present.
- Pilgrims Way has been provided with two temporary classrooms. The school failed its last two Ofsted reports but is full to capacity because children are placed there against parents' wishes. There are no plans for further expansion.
- St Polycarp's, a Catholic faith school, is also in south Farnham but it restricts places mainly to pupils of the Catholic faith and attracts pupils from a wider area.

The problems continue at secondary school level:

- Weydon and Heath End serve all the primary schools in Farnham, including Rowledge, a
 Hampshire primary school, whose pupils have automatic entry into Weydon. All Hallows,
 like St. Polycarp's, serves mainly Catholic pupils from both the town and a wider
 catchment area.
- Weydon has a PAN of 252 and has provided two additional classrooms. This year 317
 parents applied to the school as their first choice, and 218 as their second and third
 choices. Because of the pressure for places, many children in south Farnham, living

within walking distance, cannot get a place. Weydon is now an Academy and Surrey County Council has no plans to increase the size of the school further.

- Farnham Heath End has a PAN of 170 and there are plans to increase this to 230. There were 187 parent applications this year from as first choice, and 128 as second.
- For many children in south Farnham, Heath End is the nearest school, as the crow flies but the road distance is greater. These children cannot get a place, as more children from north Farnham and Aldershot live nearer. 'The Woolwich Appeal' confirmed that school places should not recognise county or borough boundaries.
- Many students in south Farnham have no access to state secondary education in the town.

Surrey County Council already busses children 12 miles to school in Camberley, to meet its obligation to provide education. Shortages of places make parents drive children to school every day and the buses and cars exacerbate the traffic delays and pollution mentioned above.

This year has seen considerable unrest among parents in south Farnham at the lack of school choice. There have been public meetings, visits to Parliament and many appeals.

As long as there is no money available for additional schooling, further housing development is unsustainable.

Farnham is the only settlement in Waverley, where uncontrolled housing development has been allowed, without adequate educational provision. This is contrary to guidance on sustainable development in sustainable communities at paragraph 124 of the DNPPF.

Town Centre Planning

East Street Development

It was not the intention of the Town Council, when it was agreed that it would produce this document, to comment on the East Street Development Plan.

However, the future of the East Street area has been brought up by stakeholders in every workshop or meeting and it was felt that these opinions should be represented in some way.

- It was widely agreed that there should be a thorough appraisal of land in Farnham town centre, to decide where housing, commercial development and retail provision should be focused, before East Street, the Woolmead, Guildford Road and the Police Station are redeveloped. The general agreement is that the East Street scheme should be rethought.
- Residents are worried that the existing contract with CNS, based on facts available in 2003, is out of date. Once again, residents and developers question whether Farnham

- needs the level and type of development, which has been agreed, when the Westgate Centre in Aldershot, just across the border, is currently under construction.
- Local developers and planning agents tell us that the large number of small flats proposed will not sell. There is no market for flats in Farnham. Townhouses would be more appropriate on that site.
- Developers and residents alike understand the need to protect and enhance the special character of the town, which makes it so appealing to many young families. There remains a need for good quality smaller houses both for older people and first-time buyers. The East Street scheme will not deliver the type of housing required in the town centre.

Key Sites

A number of key sites will shortly be or could become available in the Town Centre. These sites should not be considered individually but as a whole:

- Police Station
- Woolmead
- East Street
- Guildford Road
- The Bourne Mill

These sites, in the main, are adjacent to the historic Conservation Area. They are of extreme importance.

There is the best opportunity since the 1930s to plan the future of the town as a whole.

Conclusion

Farnham is an historic town – one of the most attractive in Surrey if not the country. It has more listed Georgian buildings than Chester despite the fact that no building has been listed since 1800! The road system was laid out more than 1000 years ago.

The settlements around the town each have a distinguished and historic character. Surrounding the town and the settlements is open countryside of great beauty – much of it not protected by planning law. Farnham Town is, however, within the protected zone of the Thames Basins Heath Spa.

The town and its settlements are located in a strategic part of the South East but the infrastructure is lacking on many counts and has not kept pace with uncontrolled and sometimes inappropriate development. Land is a scarce commodity.

It is the responsibility of this generation to ensure that Farnham is passed to the next generation in better shape, by respecting its history and ensuring that it grows with empathy – we are only caretakers.

As Roderick Gradige says, "Farnham is generally considered one of the finest of English Georgian towns, an ordinary market town which seems to have survived intact until recent years".

Farnham needs to grow but future development must be strictly controlled in both size and place. No longer can development applications be viewed in isolation but town and country planning needs to be applied, as it has been for generations past in Farnham. This is sadly lacking now.

This document along with the already accepted Farnham Design Statement will lead to a full Neighbourhood Plan for the town and its surrounding settlements, which will guide Farnham's future.

Application

This Application for Designation of a Neighbourhood Area is made under Section 61G of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and Regulation 5 (1), Part 2 SI. 2012 No. 637

Purpose

The purpose of the application is to enable Farnham Town Council to undertake neighbourhood planning, and in particular to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan.

Area

The area for the purposes of neighbourhood planning is to be the area covered by the

Farnham Town Council to its entire extent.

Comprising Local Authority Wards: Farnham Bourne,

Farnham Castle, Farnham Firgrove,

Farnham Hale and Heath End,

Farnham Moor Park,

Farnham Shortheath and Boundstone,

Farnham Upper Hale,

Farnham Weybourne and Badshot Lea, Farnham Wrecclesham and Rowledge.

Shown on the **Designation Map** (NP1) - attached.

Statement of suitability of defined area

The entirety of Farnham is the area most appropriate to be designated as a neighbourhood area for planning purposes, as it is a long established, well recognised and clearly defined area. Farnham has been a distinct settlement for many centuries with a clear physical and social identity and community focus. It has a cohesive town centre, residential and employment areas, community facilities, open spaces, listed buildings, conservation areas and special character areas. The Town is surrounded by rural and semi-rural countryside areas of open spaces and other areas including areas of landscape value.

The area is consistent with the concept of a neighbourhood area as intended by the Act and is identified in the Core Strategy Pre-submission Document approved by Waverley Borough Council.

Statement of suitability of Farnham Town Council

Farnham Town Council is a 'relevant body' for the purposes of Section 61G of the 1990 Act, and is therefore qualified to undertake neighbourhood planning. It is a democratically elected body incorporated under statute and representing the whole community within Farnham.

Farnham Council has long standing experience in working with and representing the local community including on dealing with planning matters under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and has a well established relationship with the Local Planning Authority in the preparation of Plans and Guidance and the involvement of parts of the community.

Farnham Town Council is committed to ensuring that future planning within this area reflects the community's wishes and wishes to work co-operatively with Waverley Borough Council and other statutory bodies and to fully engage with other organisations and interests.

Extract. PART 2 Neighbourhood Areas

Application for designation of a neighbourhood area

- 5.(1) Where a relevant body(12) submits an area application to the local planning authority it must include—
- (a) a map which identifies the area to which the area application relates;
- (b) a statement explaining why this area is considered appropriate to be designated as a neighbourhood area; and
- (c) a statement that the organisation or body making the area application is a relevant body for the purposes of section 61G of the 1990 Act.
- (2) A local planning authority may decline to consider an area application if the relevant body has already made an area application and a decision has not yet been made on that application.

Publicising an area application

- 6. As soon as possible after receiving an area application from a relevant body, a local planning authority must publicise the following on their website and in such other manner as they consider is likely to bring the area application to the attention of people who live, work or carry on business in the area to which the area application relates—
- (a) a copy of the area application;
- (b) details of how to make representations; and
- (c) the date by which those representations must be received, being not less than 6 weeks from the date on which the area application is first publicised.

Publicising a designation of a neighbourhood area etc

- 7.—(1) As soon as possible after designating a neighbourhood area, a local planning authority must publish the following on their website and in such other manner as they consider is likely to bring the designation to the attention of people who live, work or carry on business in the neighbourhood area—
- (a) the name of the neighbourhood area;
- (b) a map which identifies the area; and
- (c) the name of the relevant body who applied for the designation.
- (2) As soon as possible after deciding to refuse to designate a neighbourhood area, a local planning authority must publish the following on their website and in such other manner as they consider is likely to bring the refusal to the attention of people who live, work or carry on business in the neighbourhood area —
- (a) a document setting out the decision and a statement of their reasons for making that decision ("the decision document"); and
- (b) details of where and when the decision document may be inspected.

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING (GENERAL) REGULATIONS 2012 No. 637

1. This explanatory memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Communities and Local Government and is laid before Parliament by Command of Her Majesty.

2. Purpose of the instrument

2.1 The Regulations set out the procedure for the designation of neighbourhood areas and neighbourhood forums and for the preparation of neighbourhood development plans and neighbourhood development orders (including community right to build orders). A separate instrument will be brought forward in relation to neighbourhood planning referendums.

3. Matters of special interest to the Joint Committee on Statutory Instruments

- 3.1 The Regulations are the first exercise of the powers in sections 61E to G, 61L and 61M of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the 1990 Act") and sections 38A and B of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act").
- 3.2 As the Regulations make amendments to the Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2011, we have taken this opportunity to correct a number of typographical errors in that instrument, including four points which the JCSI reported on in its 30th Report (2010-12 session).

4. Legislative Context

- 4.1 Chapter 3 of Part 6 of the Localism Act 2011 creates a new neighbourhood planning regime in England mainly by inserting new provisions into the 1990 Act and the 2004 Act (*see* Part 1 of Schedule 9, and Schedules 10 and 11, for the provisions inserted into the 1990 Act, and Part 2 of Schedule 9 for the provisions inserted into the 2004 Act).
 4.2 The 1990 Act provides that within a designated neighbourhood area a parish council or a designated neighbourhood forum may propose a neighbourhood development order and Schedule 4B (as read with the modifications in Schedule 4C for community right to build orders) sets out the framework for making such orders.
- 4.3 The 2004 Act provides that within a designated neighbourhood area a parish council or a designated neighbourhood forum may propose a neighbourhood development plan and Schedule 4B to the 1990 Act (as applied, with modifications, by section 38A of the 2004 Act) sets out the framework for making such plans.
- 4.4 The Regulations build on the statutory frameworks in the 1990 Act and the 2004 Act in relation to the process for designating neighbourhood areas and neighbourhood forums and the preparation of neighbourhood development plans and neighbourhood development orders.

As you know there are two tranches – payment of £5,000 following designation and £25,000 following successful completion of the neighbourhood planning examination.

One issue which I would ask you to consider is the timing of your Plan. Bearing in mind that it will need to be in conformity with Waverley's Core Strategy you should think very carefully whether it would be best to delay finalising your Plan until such time as the Core Strategy is reaching completion and in particular has been declared "sound" by the planning inspector at the forthcoming examination. This will provide you with more certainty on the strategic policies with which you will need to accord.

I can confirm that the application accords with Regulation 5 of The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 and we will publicise the application in accordance with Regulation 6 in the week beginning 19 November 2012.

Our intention is to place the application on the web, place a notice in the Farnham Herald and write to the key stakeholders including statutory undertakers, business and amenity groups and residents' associations.

It is for you to decide how to complement our consultation provided that it is clear that the consultation is being undertaken by Waverley and all responses on the application must be sent to Waverley Borough Council. You will also be aware that Waverley Borough Council must publicise the application for at least 6 weeks.

As you know the legislation requires Neighbourhood Plans to be consistent with national planning policies, in general conformity with the strategic policies contained in the development plan for the area and otherwise compatible EU obligations. Waverley Borough Local Plan and Neighbourhood Plans

I am writing to provide an update in relation to the new Waverley Borough Local Plan and to seek some clarification with regard to your proposed Neighbourhood Plan and how this fits with the Local Plan in terms of timescale etc.

With regard to the Local Plan, you will be aware that the Waverley Core Strategy (part 1 of the new Local Plan) was submitted for Examination earlier this year but, after the initial Examination Hearings, the Plan was withdrawn from examination on the advice of the Inspector. The Council is now actively preparing a new Local Plan, taking on board the comments made by the Inspector. Our current timetable is to consult on new options in the summer of 2014, with provisional dates for Publication of the draft Plan in November 2014; Submission for examination in February 2015; and adoption in October/November 2015. Further details on the scope and timetable of the new Local Plan can be found in the report to the Council's Executive on 3rd December 2013, which can be viewed on the web site (Appendix F) at:

I would be grateful if you could provide an update on progress with your Neighbourhood Plan, including any timetable and planned consultations.

I would also like to take the opportunity to remind you that the Neighbourhood Plan should be in general conformity with the new Local Plan. You are probably familiar with paragraph 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), which states that Neighbourhood Plans should plan positively to support the strategic policies in the Local Plan. Paragraph 184 also points out that Neighbourhood Plans should not promote less development than set out in the Local Plan, or undermine its strategic policies. Having regard to this, our advice is that you should wait until the new Waverley Borough Local Plan agrees the amount of development required for your town/parish, before you complete your Neighbourhood Plan.

Note to Parish and Town Councils regarding Neighbourhood Plans

The Localism Act allows parish or town councils to prepare a neighbourhood plan. The following sets out some of the issues that will help parish or town councils decide if they should prepare one.

- It is not compulsory for parish and town councils to prepare a neighbourhood plan. If they do not, then their area will continue to be covered by the relevant policies in the adopted Local Plan, as well as supplementary planning policy documents (SPD) to decide planning applications. These include documents such as village design statements and the residential extension guidelines SPD.
- Before embarking on the exercise, parish and town councils should consider carefully what they are seeking to achieve through the neighbourhood plan. It may be that in many circumstances the Local Plan, Waverley's emerging Core Strategy, SPD or any other planning policy documents may provide them with the planning framework necessary to deliver their aspirations for their local community.
- Neighbourhood plans must generally be in line with local and national policies.
 Therefore, if the Local Plan or Core Strategy states that new homes and
 buildings must be built in their area, then a neighbourhood plan can not be
 used to block this development. However, a neighbourhood plan can propose
 more development than the Local Plan or Core Strategy.
- A neighbourhood plan can be used to influence the type, design, location and mix of new development. The government has indicated that a neighbourhood plan can be detailed or general depending what people want.
- A neighbourhood plan does not have to wait until new policies in the Local Development Framework are formally adopted. However, there are clear benefits in waiting until Waverley's Core Strategy is close to adoption to ensure that there is no conflict and wasted work.
- The Government is preparing a national planning policy framework (NPPF) to replace existing national guidance. This will be in place in 2012.
 Neighbourhood plans are required to be in line with national planning policies.
- Parish and town councils will have to pay for the preparation of their neighbourhood plan. The costs could be substantial. Waverley will not provide financial support, but will be able to give some general advice and share any relevant evidence we have already gathered for preparing our Local Development Framework. Waverley is also required to organise the

independent examination of the neighbourhood plan and if it is agreed that it is acceptable, the referendum to allow the community to decide if it should be adopted.

- Waverley is proposing to hold a neighbourhood planning event sometime in the New Year for all parish and town councils. This event will help town and parish councils decide whether they should prepare a neighbourhood plan. It will also include advice about how to get started, what a neighbourhood plan should deal with and the process for preparing one.
- The Government have produced a guide to neighbourhood plans.

Draft Farnham Neighbourhood Plan

Thank you for consulting Waverley Borough Council on the current draft of the Farnham Neighbourhood Plan.

To start on a positive note, we believe that this draft of the plan is a big improvement on the November 2013 draft that we commented on in February. However, we do have a number of comments on this draft, including some matters which we think may result in the plan failing to meet the 'basic conditions'. Other comments are offered to you in a spirit of helpfulness.

We note that the formulation of the neighbourhood plan is running broadly in parallel with that of the new Waverley Local Plan. Whilst the National Planning Practice Guidance (NPPG) clarifies that a neighbourhood plan can be developed at the same time as the Local Plan, if your plan were to run ahead of our new Local Plan there would be a significant risk that your neighbourhood plan will quickly become out of date and would need to be updated soon after it is 'made'. We would therefore caution on progressing too quickly with your plan before the spatial strategy in the Local Plan becomes clear.

We look forward to working closely with you over the coming months to address and hopefully minimise any potential conflicts between the emerging plans to ensure the neighbourhood plan has the greatest chance of success at its examination.

<u>Detailed comments on the Draft Farnham Neighbourhood Plan</u>

Waverley's detailed comments are provided below. Our key concerns are outlined at the start, focusing on those matters that could result in the plan failing to meet the basic conditions. This is followed by more detail on these and other issues. In many cases, these would be unlikely to result in the plan not meeting the basic conditions, but addressing them would, we believe, improve the plan.

Key concerns

- The draft Farnham Neighbourhood Plan (FNP) proposes some additional extensions to the Green Belt not recommended in the Green Belt Review. The NPPF states that "Green Belt boundaries should only be altered in exceptional circumstances, through the preparation or review of the Local Plan" (my emphasis). It is therefore not appropriate to propose changes to Green Belt boundaries through a neighbourhood plan. However, Following our recent meeting, I accept that you are fully aware that changes to the Green Belt is a strategic matter for the Local Plan and that the suggested changes are presented in the draft neighbourhood plan in order to test public opinion and to flag up the Town Council's current views on this matter to us. As such, our concerns have been largely alleviated.
- Unless and until the Thames Basin Heaths SPA Avoidance Strategy is reviewed, the reference in Policy FNP9 to the SANG capacity at Farnham being reserved exclusively for brownfield sites is not consistent with the Strategy. As approved, the Avoidance Strategy does not differentiate between greenfield and brownfield sites and allocation of SANG capacity at Farnham Parkmust remain on a 'first come, first served' basis until it is reviewed or updated. This review would need to be carried out in conjunction with all the neighbouring local authorities who have similar strategies and delivery frameworks and, significantly, in consultation with Natural England.
- The FNP states that it is able to accommodate (on greenfield sites) 790 dwellings above the existing potential of 1100 dwellings. This is more than would be delivered for Farnham under scenario 4 in the recent Local Plan consultation (700) but less than other scenarios. At this stage, the Borough Council has not made any decisions on a preferred scenario. If the council were to select a scenario other than scenario 4 as its preferred strategy, it is unclear what flexibility the FNP would have to adjust its approach to meet this. The NPPF states that a neighbourhood plan should support the strategic development needs set out in the Local Plan. The NPPG adds that local planning authorities and qualifying bodies should work together to produce complementary plans to minimise any conflicts with the emerging Local Plan. Moreover, if the neighbourhood plan were to proceed in advance of the new Local Plan and the Local Plan was adopted shortly after the FNP with a higher housing requirement for Farnham, the FNP would cease to be in general conformity with the Local Plan and would have to be revised. It would thus have a very short 'shelf life'. Therefore we would strongly advise that the FNP include flexibility so that additional sites can be added if the published Local Plan Part 1 has a strategy which seeks a higher housing number for Farnham than you are currently proposing.

• The draft FNP proposes to amend the adopted Town Centre boundary to exclude the northern end of Castle Street and the western end of West Street. Waverley's Town centre boundaries were defined for the current 2002 Local Plan. The Waverley Town Centre Retail Study 2013 did not suggest any amendments to any of the town centre boundaries. The NPPF states in paragraph 23 that "in drawing up Local Plans, local planning authorities should...define the extent of town centres and primary shopping areas, based on a clear definition of primary and secondary shopping frontages in designated centres". Therefore, we do not consider that it is appropriate for the FNP to be seeking to redefine the Farnham Town Centre boundary.

Other comments

There is a lot of potential overlap between what is in the draft FNP and what is likely to be in the new Local Plan. Examples include

- the general policy on house extensions,
- the policy on Buildings of Local Merit
- the policies on the Thames Basin Heaths SPA and biodiversity
- the policies on indoor sports facilities and cultural facilities, and
- the policies on transport and infrastructure.

None of these policies appear to be specific to Farnham and there is a danger that essentially the same policies will appear in both the Local Plan and the FNP, which would be unnecessary and potentially confusing. What do these policies add locally to those in the Local Plan?

There are a number of saved non strategic policies in the current Waverley Borough Local Plan 2002 that relate specifically to Farnham, which the Neighbourhood Plan may wish to incorporate. These policies may not be replaced in Part 2 of the Local Plan, but nevertheless may have local significance and could be appropriate to incorporate into the Neighbourhood Plan. We would suggest that you examine the 2002 Plan to see if there are any such policies that you may want to include to avoid a potential policy gap, for example in Chapter 9 Town Centres. It would be helpful if the version of the FNP submitted to WBC clearly sets out which of the non strategic policies in the current Local Plan they would be replacing.

Section 1 - Introduction

Page 1 – the fifth paragraph of the introduction suggests that the Town Council will, once the Neighbourhood Plan is adopted (or more accurately 'made') be determining planning applications within Farnham. Of course, this responsibility will still rest with the Borough Council, although the Town Council will continue to be statutorily consulted on applications.

The phrase "The neighbourhood Plan designation was approved..." should read "The neighbourhood area was designated...

Page 2 – The title of Figure 1 ("Designation Map") is unclear. I would suggest that it is titled "Farnham Neighbourhood Area".

Page 3 – This table appears to contain several errors. Firstly, there are two mandatory six week consultation periods set out in the Neighbourhood Plan Regulations. These are at the pre-submission stage (Regulation 14 (a)(iv)) and after submission to the LPA (Regulation 16(a)(v)). The first of these periods will take place, it is assumed, in April 2015. The latter would then take place after submission to WBC in Summer 2015. However, in the table it shows two six week periods both in Summer 2015.

Secondly, I consider that the timetable for the stage from Examination to Adoption is over-ambitious. The gap between examination and referendum would be at least 3 months, as the referendum cannot be arranged until the examiner's report confirms that it passes the basic conditions (and can therefore proceed to referendum). This is too risky from a cost perspective. The examiner may take a month or longer to publish his report. Also, once the Neighbourhood Plan has passed this stage, WBC are required to publish information about the plan 28 working days before the date of the referendum, and then to give notice of the referendum and the date of the poll 25 working days before. Having a referendum the winter months runs the risk of a low turnout, as well as presenting difficulties in terms of management of the electoral process, and adherence to key dates in the election timetable, in the run up to the election over the Christmas/New Year period.

Finally, in the Adoption box, it says "Plan given full weight by MSDC". This should, of course, read "WBC".

Page 4 – I suggest that the final sentence of the first paragraph is amended to read "... for the area, and the emerging new Waverley Local Plan".

Section 2 – Farnham Now

General comment – this section ("Farnham Now") establishes the baseline position and should be 'policy neutral'. However, in several places there are sentences that appear to set a policy direction. For example, under Local Economy (page 9) it states that "Outmoded employment land should be considered for housing development". It might be better to avoid such statements in this section and instead keep it factual.

Page 7 – it would be helpful to clarify that only parts of Farnham are within the 5km buffer zone of these two SPAs. They are actually called the Thames Basin Heaths SPA and the Wealden Heaths SPA.

In the second paragraph of the section on Housing, the wording used is not a direct or very accurate interpretation of the NPPF. For example, the words "...taking into account any specific policies in the Framework which indicate development should be restricted" are taken from paragraph 14 of the NPPF but this applies to Local Plan-making and not Neighbourhood Plan-making.

The housing need identified in the draft SHMA for Waverley is around 470 new homes per annum but this does not equal "around 9400 homes" for the 2013-31 period. It should read "around 8,450 homes".

The heading of the table at the bottom of the page on the four Local Plan scenarios is misleading. The 1100 dwellings figure is not "existing provision" but represents the completions (since 2013), outstanding permissions, capacity from urban SHLAA sites and a windfall allowance. The "additional homes" figures represent new greenfield sites outside of the current built up area.

Page 10 – Some of the statements used in the Roads and Transport section seem to be assertions and it is not clear if they are evidence based. For example, where is the evidence that traffic issues in Upper Hale, Weybourne and Badshot Lea "will be exacerbated by significant developments in neighbouring boroughs"?

Page 11 – the second sentence under Sewage capacity / water appears to have a word missing. Should it read "There is concern that the works will **not** be able to accommodate the development options included in the Neighbourhood Plan"?

Section 3 – Farnham Future

Page 12 – it is not clear if the vision is the text in the blue box or that below it, or both parts.

Section 4 – Draft Neighbourhood Plan Strategy

Page 16 – penultimate paragraph on SANG: The phrase "severely restricted" is perhaps too strong. In the second line it should read "Thames Basin Heaths". The proposal that SANG capacity be reserved for brownfield sites is not currently allowed under the protocol agreed with the other authorities affected by the Thames Basin Heaths.

Page 17 – Waverley is also having discussions with the infrastructure providers on different levels of development in the Borough, including in Farnham, and there is potential for duplication and confusion.

Section 5 - Draft Neighbourhood Plan Policies

Environment

Page 19 - top paragraph. We would suggest the link goes to the Waverley webpage www.waverley.gov.uk/conservationareas. This will link to the conservation homepage which will include all the conservation area appraisals including Wrecclesham and Farnham (and eventually including Great Austins and Old Church Lane). Alternatively, we are happy to create friendly URLs to each of the conservation area webpages, if that helps.

Page 22 - final paragraph may need to be clearer, possibly to read, "The design and layout for specific sites (for residential development) and residential extensions...". I would also suggest to replace the "but Policy" with "and Policy".

Page 23 - FNP1 – This seems like a reasonable and standard design policy, and making the links to the adopted Design Statement is both important and relevant.

Page 24 - if not using the link above, there should be a link to the FCAMP document on the Waverley website (again I can get a friendly URL set up if needed).

Page 25 - **FNP2** – I would suggest that criteria (d) could be expanded to encourage new yards to be incorporated into new developments where appropriate.

There is a typo in third line after the policy. "...all types of premises I the Conservation Area" should read: "all types of premises in the Conservation Area."

Its important to note that there are shop fronts outside the CA – against which policies will these be assessed?

Page 26: "...subtle method of illumination. Painted fascia boards..." It might clarify to insert an additional sentence between these two: "This might be acceptable for premises, such as pubs and restaurants, that trade late into the night."

Page 27 - FNP3 — I suggest that the words "would be in sympathy" in criteria (b) and (c) be replaced with "should respect". Is criterion (e) acceptable because it, in essence, prevents internally illuminated signage?

Page 28 - FNP4 – this seems fine, but should it not apply to all adverts, not just those within the CA?

FNP2-4 – what is meant by 'setting' and how far reaching would these policies apply? Are these policies equally relevant to areas outside the Town Centre CA (e.g. other shopping areas within Wrecclesham etc.)?

Page 28 – I am not aware of the term Arcadian: other readers may also be unaware. I assume there will be a glossary of terms?

Page 30 - **FNP5** – Is this policy intended to replace policies BE3 (South Farnham Area of Special Environmental Quality) and BE6 (Low Density Residential Areas, which includes Great Austins) in the current Local Plan?

In criterion (c), we are concerned about the use of the word "unobtrusively", which means not undesirably noticeable or blatant; inconspicuous. Most extensions or development would be noticeable (although not necessarily undesirable). Could this be defined more clearly (i.e. is this concerned with the use of materials? Height, scale, mass, location or a combination of all of these matters?)

We are keen not to devalue the status of Buildings of Local Merit. Instead of saying: "... while not of sufficient special historic and/or architectural interest to warrant designation as listed buildings, have a distinct and valued local character and/or appearance that are worthy of retention ..", we suggest it says "...whilst they do not meet the criteria for listing for their national importance, have distinct and valued local character and/or appearance worthy of retention..."

We cannot see the evidence base for Buildings of Local Merit on the FTC website.

Page 31 - FNP6 – we suggest that this policy should be called Buildings of Local Merit (for consistency).

Page 34 – The section on Preventing coalescence uses the words "propose" and "proposes" in relation to the Green Belt Review. However, it does not make any proposals, but instead makes recommendations. We suggest this word is used instead. The heading and key on the map on page 35 similarly should be amended.

Page 33 Map E – the segment to the south of Odiham Road is only moderate in terms of Landscape Value and Sensitivity (FN9 page 44 of study) so for consistency, should be removed.

European Special Protection Areas

Page 38 – I note the reference to the South East Plan Policy NRM6 and the comment that "priority should be given to directing development to those areas where potential adverse effects can be avoided without the need for mitigation measures". This issue and how it affects the spatial distribution of new housing in Waverley Is a matter for the Local Plan and should not be pre-empted by the Farnham (or any other) Neighbourhood Plan.

Page 39 - In order to perform as a SANG, the site quality checklist, as advised by Natural England is extensive and goes well beyond a minimum 2 ha requirement. In particular, it requires the inclusion of a circular walk of 2.3 to 2.5 km around the SANG and appropriate levels of car parking. Reference should be made in the FNP to this checklist.

Monitoring the implementation of the TBH SPA shows the latest estimate of SANG capacity at Farnham Park (November 2014) as 253 dwellings (4.9 ha; not including pending applications/appeals or outstanding payments).

Page 40 - The draft policy should also refer to the site quality checklist as a whole, rather than the single (and not entirely accurate) reference to the 2 ha minimum size.

Housing

Page 43 – The quoted figure of 9400 homes for the net need in Waverley Borough does not correspond to any figure set out in the recent Local Plan consultation. It would be more accurate to state that the estimated need of 470 homes per year equates to around 8450 over the plan period (2013-2031).

The phrase "residents are keen that this is absorbed within the environmental constraints" is vague and unclear.

Page 43 - The approach in the NPPF is for Local Planning Authorities is to objectively assess its housing needs and then to test if those needs can realistically be delivered. The Borough Council has assessed its needs through the draft (Waverley & West Surrey) SHMA (2013) and will shortly be publishing its final (Guildford, Woking and Waverley) SHMA. It follows that the testing process for delivering those needs, in terms of both numbers and distribution, has yet to be completed.

The key issue here is that neighbourhood plans should facilitate delivery of the amount of housing and other uses set out in the Local Plan. In the absence of this, it is not clear what the justification is for the housing number identified in the FNP. It just states that the number of sites is approximately 790

dwellings over the 1100 dwellings stated in the Housing Scenarios consultation that could be potentially built from existing permissions, windfall sites and mainly brownfield sites.

Page 44 - Housing completions - The figures used are up to 31st March 2014. To be consistent with the other components of supply 30 dwelling completed since then and 1st October 2014 should be added.

Windfalls – As the Waverley SHLAA is based on 01/04/14 the table will need to take off half a year's worth of small and large windfalls which will give an overall total of 311 up to 31/03/31.

Page 45 - Summary - The changes to the components of supply above means that the summary table should be changed and gives a total of 874 dwellings (see below)

The 1100 referred to in Waverley's consultation comprises 835 commitments within settlements (completions, outstanding permission and windfalls) and 260 from sites identified within the settlements in the SHLAA as of 1st April 2014. It does not include any sites outside the settlement boundary and therefore does not include brownfield sites in this location.

Page 45 - The site size threshold for the FHLAA sites at over 0.2 ha is inconsistent with Waverley's SHLAA which has a threshold of 5 dwellings or more (for sites within the settlement area). Waverley's estimate of small windfalls is also based on sites of fewer than 5 dwellings. The FNP assessment of capacity therefore underestimates the number of potential dwellings from within the built up area compared to Waverley's SHLAA as it will exclude those sites below the site area threshold that could achieve more than 5 and they can not be included as part of the small windfalls estimate. This is particularly so for sites in town centres where higher densities are more appropriate.

The number of dwellings from sites not currently allocated is put forward as 245 on largely brownfield sites from FNP11(a) – (f). However:

- Does site c) Part of SSE Depot also include the greenfield element, i.e. the part outside the settlement boundary?
- The number does not include those sites g) to j) which are also within the settlement except for h) the Brethren's meeting room which is not. This site was granted consent as an exception to policy on the grounds it was providing a community use.

Page 46 – Where is the evidence that the five sites listed all have the capacity to provide on-site SANG? See previous comments about the need to satisfy the site quality checklist, not just meeting a minimum site size requirement.

Pages 47- 48 – **FNP11** - As a general comment, it is noted that all of the included sites k) to r) have been given a RAG score of Green or Amber in the Waverley SHLAA 2014, which shows a good degree of agreement between the authorities on the suitability of sites. The estimated yields do differ between the SHLAA and the FHLAA on some sites, especially those where on site SANG is required, e.g. (n) to (r).

We have also spotted that sites k) to q) in this policy are shown in a different order in Appendix 2 of the FHLAA. This is confusing.

Site j) Coal Yard, The Street, Wrecclesham – Waverley did include this site in its SHLAA published in 2011 but rejected it from subsequent updates on the grounds of availability. It is appreciated that the FLHAA may entice the owner to promote the site but the NPPF says that the SHLAA needs to establish realistic assumptions about delivery. Therefore, it should not be included as a deliverable site until there is evidence to support this assessment.

We note that one of the supporting evidence documents for the FNP provides details of 31 sites that were considered but not included as site options. Two of these sites were rated Green in the latest version of the Waverley SHLAA and 11 were rated as Amber. We note that in several instances, one of the reasons given for not including the site is a lack of SANG provision. However, many of the sites that this applies to are very small, and we query whether it is appropriate or reasonable to reject these sites on this ground. I would suggest that you reconsider whether any of these sites have potential for development, in particular those rated in the recent WBC SHLAA as Green or Amber, even if this is subject to the caveat that SANG provision will also be required. Following the recent Local Plan consultation, we will be reviewing the SHLAA. We will be reviewing this to take account of comments made to the consultation on the Local Plan and we will also take into account the information in the FHLAA.

Page 49 - It would be helpful to refer to the 2013 Waverley and West Surrey SHMA.

Page 50 - FNP12 encourages proposals for 1 and 2 bedrooms on smaller sites in the built up area but the evidence is for 3 bedrooms as well, particularly in the market housing sector. What justification is there for the policy requirement? Is it to take account of the suppression of household type in the past or is it to ensure that the development maximises the number of homes on the site? What does the FNP define as a smaller site in the built up area?

Business

Page 54 - Need to be more specific which Employment Land Review is being referred to? Is it the Waverley one or Farnham's as both were published in 2014 (Waverley's was updated).

Is the expression "acceptably located" meant to be "suitably located"?

Page 55 - FNP14 - Land for Business

The sites id reference in the policy does not match up with the ELR reference.

The Waverly ELR includes more sites than Farnham ELR. Is there a reason for this? Has a site threshold been applied? If they are omitted, are they still to be safeguarded?

Some of the sites that appear to be recommended for retention in the ELR assessments do not appear to be included in the policy for retention (i.e. EM21 Millennium Centre and EM22 Headway House)

Some of the sites have been assessed as being sui generis (although their use has not been verified by Waverley). Although Waverley's Local Plan employment policies technically only relates to B uses, if there is evidence that these sites make an important contribution to the Farnham economy that you want to maintain, is this an opportunity for the FNP to safeguard these sites as employment generating sites?

Will the FNP set out in more detail how it can be demonstrated that the site has no reasonable prospect of business use being taken up or continued? Is the period of the Neighbourhood Plan the right length of time? What evidence is there for using this period?

The assessments in the Farnham ELR use criteria relating to planning constraints. How important are these constraints in terms of considering whether an existing employment site should be retained? The assessment does not accord with the policy FNP14 which talks about retaining employment sites where it can be demonstrated that they can continue to be used for that purpose, not on their impact on strategic planning designations.

Page 55 - Where is the evidence of a shortage of high quality modern accommodation? Is it from the interviews with commercial agents held in August 2014?

Page 56 – **FNP15** – Business Site Option.

We note that you are proposing a business site allocation but the Local Plan has not yet provided the context on how much employment land is needed. We anticipate that a further update to the Employment Land Review will provide more definitive idea of the employment land needed. This policy is extremely vague. It will be necessary to provide a much clearer indication of the uses and quantum of development on this site in the submission version of the FNP.

Page 57 - Need to specify that it is the permitted development rights that allow for agricultural buildings under 500 sq m to change to a number of other uses.

What justification is there for not normally permitting the re use of rural buildings for residential purposes? See NPPF paras 51 and 55. Furthermore the change to permitted development rights from April 2014 now allows a change of use from agriculture to residential subject to prior approval received by the Local Planning Authority.

Farnham Town centre & Local centres

Page 59 - The draft FNP proposes to amend the adopted Town Centre boundary to exclude the northern end of Castle Street and the western end of West Street in Map L (page 59), as 'these areas are occupied almost exclusively by residential properties.' We consider that Castle Street does form part of the town centre from a character point of view. It is a wide, impressive road acting as a gateway to the shopping area; you have the feeling of being 'in the town' driving down it. It should not be confused with the shopping centre, which is a different boundary. We also do not consider that the boundary should be amended to remove the western part of West Street, as this area includes the library, the museum and their grounds, which are appropriate town centre uses, fulfilling the NPPF definition of cultural uses. As stated earlier, the NPPF states Local Plans should define town centre boundaries and the extent of town centres and primary shopping areas.

Page 60 – We note that the FNP does not specifically mention the issue of primary and secondary shopping frontages within the town centre. In line with the NPPF, WBC intends to identify these in Local Plan Part 2. However, we would be happy to work with you to seek to reach an agreement on the appropriate town centre boundary and shopping frontages in the town.

Whilst the Woolmead is close to the CA boundary, the plan explains that it is within the setting of the CA and therefore Policies FNP2-4 apply. Please refer to the point above about these policies and how far reaching 'setting' is.

Page 61 - **FNP17** – this is a generic policy for the Woolmead. A development brief for the site has been developed which gives some guiding principles for future development. This can be seen on the WBC website. You may wish to consider expanding the policy include some key principles and/or aims for its future development.

On page 61, it states that there is a strong demand for town centre office uses, which is another reason why it may not be appropriate to reduce the designated town centre area.

Page 63 - The draft Core Strategy defined a hierarchy of Town, Local, and then Neighbourhood/village centres. I would not anticipate this approach changing in the new Local Plan. In that draft, Farncombe, Milford and Bramley were defined as Local Centres, as they had more of a range of facilities and in particular a larger number of shops and facilities. Centres such as those suggested in the draft FNP were categorised under Neighbourhood centres. This approach was also supported in the Town Centre Retail Study. This difference in terminology could lead to confusion.

Page 64 - Similarly, the further centres identified could possibly be added after some investigation, but again they might be better categorised as Neighbourhood centres. Please note that The Street, Wrecclesham has already been included in the current list.

Leisure and Wellbeing

General - The section dealing with public open space, recreation and culture covers matters where Waverley BC provides or funds services. I understand that to date you have not liaised with the relevant officers at Waverley in drawing up these policies and I suggest, therefore, that you contact Matt Lank, the Land Asset Manager in Community Services to discuss this further.

Page 68 - It is critical that the provision for Children and Young People is later updated in line with the draft Play Space Strategy which is still being produced by WBC. This is expected to be adopted early next year. More detailed information could then be included, such as local standards specific to Farnham. Currently we use FIT standards for provision, which has been incorporated.

Page 72 - Maps P and Q show the same site. The Draft FNP identifies the former tip at Weydon Lane (Brambleton Park) as a site for sports pitches. This land is owned by Waverley BC, and in view of its former use there are issues around what it could be used for in the future. Again I suggest an early discussion with relevant Waverley officers.

Page 75 - The museum is within the town centre, as is the library.

In the section on culture, should UCA Farnham be mentioned with its galleries?

Local Infrastructure

Page 79 - **FNP23** is a generic transport impact policy that (with the possible exception of the passing reference to air quality issues) is not specific to Farnham. In practice, it would do little more than repeat the equivalent strategic policy that will eventually feature in Local Plan Part 1. The same sentiment would apply to **FNP24**.

The reference to consultation with infrastructure provides repeats (virtually word for word) the statement to that effect earlier in the draft document (page 9).

No reference is made in this section to energy supply, telecommunications, health, public transport. Is this because you do not consider these to be an issue for Farnham or is it because you have not dealt with these providers yet?

Consultation with infrastructure providers - Is it the role of the FNP to consider infrastructure capacity etc. or is it the role of the Local Plan? We are concerned about potential duplication and confusion. Our Local Plan, which should set out the level of growth in Farnham, will also be accompanied by detailed evidence on infrastructure capacity and the infrastructure required to support new development. Have you looked at the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) that accompanied the Core Strategy (which we will be updating)?

Dear Rachel,

As you know, Councillor Cockburn wrote to Graham and Matthew recently to see if a meeting could be set up with the planning inspectorate to get a definitive answer on whether the Farnham NDP needs to identify SANG provision or whether it can allocate sites on the assumption that WBC will ensure future provision. PINS do not generally get involved in neighbourhood plan examinations but an organisation called NPIERS (the Neighbourhood Planning Independent Examiner Referral Services) play a similar role.

I have contacted NPIERS and explained the situation. They said that there are two options – arrange a pre submission 'health check' with an experienced NDP examiner or obtain technical support through AECOM, who have the national contract to provide this for NDPs. NPIERS referred me to an experienced examiner, Clare Wright, who is willing to undertake a health check for the Farnham NDP, focusing on the relationship between the emerging neighbourhood and local plans and the SANG issue. Clare has undertaken several NDP examinations (including the Henfield NDP in Horsham district) and has a "moveable diary".

Having discussed with Matthew, we consider that the best way forward, at least initially, is to go down the health check route. This would include a meeting to be held in the next few weeks. We are happy to facilitate and pay for this (estimated to be around £750 for 2 days work). Are you happy with this approach? If so, I have completed the health check application form and this is attached. Please let me have any comments on the completed form, so that I can return this to NPIERS this week.

We think that there would be some benefit in not proceeding further with the neighbourhood plan (for example issuing a new version of the plan for pre-submission consultation) until we have had this meeting. Do you agree? Do you have a current draft of the plan that could be circulated to inform this meeting?

Many thanks and I hope to hear from you soon.

In November ourselves and Waverley BC commissioned an NP examiner to look over our Neighbourhood Plan and provide advice specifically on the NP and SANGS.

The report we have had back from her back suggests that:

- A "brownfield first" for SANGS sites such as Farnham Park, policy in the FNP is possible but would need to be endorsed by WBC and Natural England.
- The wording of a policy that sets out the mitigation requirements which affect development within the zone of influence should reflect accurately the wording of the draft Local Plan policy.
- The FNP may allocate sites and rely on the current Supplementary Planning Document and emerging Local Plan to allocate SANGS, in order to provide certainty and clarity to developers and this facilitate development.
- A project based approach may be the most suitable to the FNP in identifying SANGS. This would be in the form of a "working note", jointly undertaken by WBC and FTC and would set out how SANGS will be managed and allocated in the FNP area, in order to satisfy an examiner that the site allocations in the FNP are deliverable and sustainable.

I was wondering if you could please advise us of your views on these points and if this approach would satisfy Natural England in respect of the Neighbourhood Plan?

In reply to Clare's questions –

- (i) Waverley's only current SANG resource is that at Farnham Park. The notional area designated as SANG amounts to 25% of the total park area 21.25 ha. This acts as a strategic resource that is available to mitigate approved housing developments within 5 km of the TBH SPA.
- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently **1,348** dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly

monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's <u>Western Area Planning Committee</u>. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

In reply to Clare's questions –

- (i) Waverley's only current SANG resource is that at Farnham Park. The notional area designated as SANG amounts to 25% of the total park area 21.25 ha. This acts as a strategic resource that is available to mitigate approved housing developments within 5 km of the TBH SPA.
- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently **1,348** dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly

monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's <u>Western Area Planning Committee</u>. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently 1,348 dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's Western Area Planning Committee. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

- (i) Waverley's only current SANG resource is that at Farnham Park. The notional area designated as SANG amounts to 25% of the total park area 21.25 ha. This acts as a strategic resource that is available to mitigate approved housing developments within 5 km of the TBH SPA.
- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently 1,348 dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's Western Area Planning Committee. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

Yes I know Carole met with you both last week but my understand was that this wasn't in an FTC capacity. This is why there wasn't an FTC officer at the meeting. I think she really wanted an update as a member on what WBC is doing and sees itself doin following Claire's report and the work you are doing with Farnham Park capacity.

As you know, Carole can't as a single member, agree the Town Council's strategy or position. I would think we would also need to ensure Natural England are on board with the approach we all agree on too before we set anything in stone.

In the note I gave Carole to pass on to you (I hope she left you with a copy – but have pasted some if the text below just in case) I highlighted NE's initial observations on the report.

In the short term I feel that we need to agree what further clarity we wish to seek from Claire's report in order to have it finalised so that it can be used to help us make decisions and be made public. At the moment it doesn't offer much certainty and points out that there is a divergence of opinion, which we all knew but were seeking to clarify.

Regarding Natural England's endorsement of our joint approach, I provided Marc Turner at NE with some excerpts from the report and his observations were (I did not send him a full copy as I felt it wasn't appropriate whilst in draft form). I provided the below points for comment:

- A "brownfield first" for SANGS sites such as Farnham Park, policy in the FNP is possible but would need to be endorsed by WBC and Natural England.
- The wording of a policy that sets out the mitigation requirements which affect development within the zone of influence should reflect accurately the wording of the draft Local Plan policy.
- The FNP may allocate sites and rely on the current Supplementary Planning
 Document and emerging Local Plan to allocate SANGS, in order to provide
 certainty and clarity to developers and this facilitate development.
- A project based approach may be the most suitable to the FNP in identifying SANGS. This would be in the form of a "working note", jointly undertaken by WBC and FTC and would set out how SANGS will be managed and allocated in the FNP area, in order to satisfy an examiner that the site allocations in the FNP are deliverable and sustainable.

Marc's response:

I definitely agree with the first 3 bullet points, the 4th maybe needs a little clarification. I have no issues with the project approach; we will just need to be certain there is enough SANG coming forward for the sites allocated in FNP, at the plan stage. So the plan may say it is allocating 2000 homes, so we will need to see where the 38ha will be the SANG. The Inspector for the Rushmoor Local Plan, wanted to see lines on maps and SANGs identified. They did have a slightly dodgy TBH policy, which through the examination we got tightened up. I think we would need to see lines on maps outlining where "the preferred SANG solution" will go, along with policy wording in line with all other TBH Policy. If when it comes to the crunch different SANGs are put forward, we will be happy as long as they fit the bill.

So as far as I can tell, the assumption at the moment is that the FNP can rely on the LP for to deliver SANGs. However, Clare's report is unclear as to how this is acceptable in practice – i.e. what we need to do to prove it to an examiner. Further questions need to be agreed and put to Clare before her report is finalised. Most importantly, from what Marc has said now and in previous meetings, NE will not support the FNP unless there are lines on maps illustrating "preferred solutions".

Also to clarify, as I have had the opportunity to read the helpful letter from Matthew and discussed the report with Tony, the Town Council are unlikely to follow the route of allocating possible SANG solutions as LGS as the areas we were/are considering for SANG are not particularly beautiful, of historic significance, or of recreational value (including as a playing field), tranquillity or richness of wildlife. It may also be argued that, in order to meet the NE minimum size, they are extensive tracts of land. If the NP Examiner considers our SANG sites fail to pass the above tests as Local Open Space (rather than those for SANG) we would be left with no SANG to support the NP — which would then be undeliverable. It would seem preferable and less risky to allocate sites for which we want them used (i.e. SANG) rather than use the Trojan horse technique which lacks transparency and risks failure.

Natural England have also endorsed (as did Claire) the possibility of the FNP having a "brownfield first" policy so I would really like to discuss this further with you.

I look forward to hearing back from you and would still favour a joint approach where we can all agree Claire's report and get it finalised, allowing us to form and agree actions to move the Plan forward.

The most recent report to the Western Area Planning Committee (January 2016) can be seen here. This gives the current unallocated SANG capacity at Farnham Park as 315 dwellings.

With regard to consents granted since April 14, I can give you the following information:

As of 1/4/15, there were outstanding planning permissions for 1,704 homes (net) across Waverley. As of 1/10/15, there were 1,737 homes with an outstanding permission, with 270 more approved subject to a legal agreement. This is taken from the <u>Five Year Land Supply statement 1/10/15</u>. If this is not the information you need, please let me know and I will see if Annie Reid, who monitors housing permissions and completions, can help you.

Finally, regarding your request to get together to discuss Clare's report, Cllr Cockburn recently requested a meeting on this matter with Matthew Evans and met with Matthew, myself and Gareth Evans last week (12 January). Did Cllr Cockburn not mention this to you? At the meeting, Matthew agreed to produce a letter setting out Waverley's position on the provision of SANG through the neighbourhood plan, in light of Clare's report. The broad approach we agreed is that the FNP would identify housing sites (with SANG provision demonstrated to be available) for the first 5 years but for longer term sites, SANG provision would be made through the Local Plan. The letter that is currently being drafted will explain this in more detail.

The most recent report to the Western Area Planning Committee (January 2016) can be seen here. This gives the current unallocated SANG capacity at Farnham Park as 315 dwellings.

With regard to consents granted since April 14, I can give you the following information:

As of 1/4/15, there were outstanding planning permissions for 1,704 homes (net) across Waverley. As of 1/10/15, there were 1,737 homes with an outstanding permission, with 270 more approved subject to a legal agreement. This is taken from the <u>Five Year Land Supply statement 1/10/15</u>. If this is not the information you need, please let me know and I will see if Annie Reid, who monitors housing permissions and completions, can help you.

Finally, regarding your request to get together to discuss Clare's report, ClIr Cockburn recently requested a meeting on this matter with Matthew Evans and met with Matthew, myself and Gareth Evans last week (12 January). Did ClIr Cockburn not mention this to you? At the meeting, Matthew agreed to produce a letter setting out Waverley's position on the provision of SANG through the neighbourhood plan, in light of Clare's report. The broad approach we agreed is that the FNP would identify housing sites (with SANG provision demonstrated to be available) for the first 5 years but for longer term sites, SANG provision would be made through the Local Plan. Thank you for getting back to me.

Whilst I respect your position am slightly disappointed at the apparent desire to not work together on this.

The meeting with Claire very encouraging, especially the openness on all sides to embrace the opportunity to share, be transparent and come to a mutual agreement which allows the progression of the FNP and the LP in the most appropriate timescale for the benefit of local people.

I would suggest that if you have a difference of opinion to NE, that this should be discussed in detail. Without an open debate following the report, it is incredibly difficult to move forward. Claire's report is clear on the fact that we need to ensure our approach is supported by NE and so discussion with them is key to agreeing a solution or approach. Would you not agree with this? I would point out that we were not assuming any weight to what Marc Turner has said, especially in comparing us to Rushmoor which we would also question, but I was simply sharing the feedback with you to help our conversation and highlighted that it was his initial feedback. I had hoped that you had a view on his comments which would reflect ours and I could send a joint response for further clarification.

If Waverley has formed a view on the report I would suggest that this be communicated to Farnham Town Council appropriately. The letter to Councillor Cockburn (as a Borough Councillor) is not a formal response to the Town Council – this communication should be sent to the Town Clerk. The Town Council has agreed, on receipt of the report, to defer deciding on an approach before having detailed discussions with yourselves and Natural England so that the approach we take is something all parties agree on.

It would be a shame if we cannot continue the positive relationship that was present at the meeting with Claire, where we all agreed that we needed to communicate and work together to get the NP to the next stage.

In relation to Clare's draft report, I don't see that we can admit that it over complicates the situation, yet not provide the opportunity for it to be clarified. It would seem a waste of resources to sign the report off as complete, whilst acknowledging that it does not serve the purpose of the initial brief. If Waverley does not wish to progress this with NPIERS jointly with Farnham Town Council, then the Town Council will need to consider if it should clarify any outstanding matters with Claire directly.

Thanks for your email, which I have forwarded to and discussed with Matthew. This response is based on this discussion.

Our view on Clare's report is that whilst it perhaps overcomplicates things and is not as useful as we hoped, we are not proposing to request any changes to it. We intend to use it as a background paper but with no status.

With regard to Marc's comments, we do not consider that too much weight should be given to his comment about not supporting the FNP unless it contains 'lines on maps' with 'preferred solutions'. His comments related to a local plan examination at Rushmoor and there is a big difference between a neighbourhood plan and a local plan.

We note your comment that the FNP is unlikely to allocate SANG as Local Greenspace, as the sites being considered would not meet the criteria for LGS set in the NPPF.

Regarding the 'brownfield first' approach, NE and Clare both agree this is possible, but only if endorsed by WBC. Our position is very clear on this, as set out in Matthew's letter.

Matthew does not consider that there would be any benefit in a further meeting at this stage. The letter sets out our position clearly and we are not sure what else we can discuss.

Yes I know Carole met with you both last week but my understand was that this wasn't in an FTC capacity. This is why there wasn't an FTC officer at the meeting. I think she really

wanted an update as a member on what WBC is doing and sees itself doin following Claire's report and the work you are doing with Farnham Park capacity.

As you know, Carole can't as a single member, agree the Town Council's strategy or position. I would think we would also need to ensure Natural England are on board with the approach we all agree on too before we set anything in stone.

In the note I gave Carole to pass on to you (I hope she left you with a copy – but have pasted some if the text below just in case) I highlighted NE's initial observations on the report.

In the short term I feel that we need to agree what further clarity we wish to seek from Claire's report in order to have it finalised so that it can be used to help us make decisions and be made public. At the moment it doesn't offer much certainty and points out that there is a divergence of opinion, which we all knew but were seeking to clarify.

Regarding Natural England's endorsement of our joint approach, I provided Marc Turner at NE with some excerpts from the report and his observations were (I did not send him a full copy as I felt it wasn't appropriate whilst in draft form). I provided the below points for comment:

- A "brownfield first" for SANGS sites such as Farnham Park, policy in the FNP is possible but would need to be endorsed by WBC and Natural England.
- The wording of a policy that sets out the mitigation requirements which affect development within the zone of influence should reflect accurately the wording of the draft Local Plan policy.
- The FNP may allocate sites and rely on the current Supplementary Planning
 Document and emerging Local Plan to allocate SANGS, in order to provide
 certainty and clarity to developers and this facilitate development.
- A project based approach may be the most suitable to the FNP in identifying SANGS. This would be in the form of a "working note", jointly undertaken by WBC and FTC and would set out how SANGS will be managed and allocated in the FNP area, in order to satisfy an examiner that the site allocations in the FNP are deliverable and sustainable.

Marc's response:

I definitely agree with the first 3 bullet points, the 4th maybe needs a little clarification. I have no issues with the project approach; we will just need to be certain there is enough SANG coming forward for the sites allocated in FNP, at the plan stage. So the plan may say it is allocating 2000 homes, so we will need to see where the 38ha will be the SANG. The Inspector for the Rushmoor Local Plan, wanted to see lines on maps and SANGs identified. They did have a slightly dodgy TBH policy, which through the examination we got tightened up. I think we would need to see lines on maps outlining where "the preferred SANG solution" will go, along with policy wording in line with all other TBH Policy. If when it comes to the crunch different SANGs are put forward, we will be happy as long as they fit the bill.

So as far as I can tell, the assumption at the moment is that the FNP can rely on the LP for to deliver SANGs. However, Clare's report is unclear as to how this is acceptable in practice – i.e. what we need to do to prove it to an examiner. Further questions need to be agreed and put to Clare before her report is finalised. Most importantly, from what Marc has said now and in previous meetings, NE will not support the FNP unless there are lines on maps illustrating "preferred solutions".

Also to clarify, as I have had the opportunity to read the helpful letter from Matthew and discussed the report with Tony, the Town Council are unlikely to follow the route of allocating possible SANG solutions as LGS as the areas we were/are considering for SANG are not particularly beautiful, of historic significance, or of recreational value (including as a playing field), tranquillity or richness of wildlife. It may also be argued that, in order to meet the NE minimum size, they are extensive tracts of land. If the NP Examiner considers our SANG sites fail to pass the above tests as Local Open Space (rather than those for SANG) we would be left with no SANG to support the NP – which would then be undeliverable. It would seem preferable and less risky to allocate sites for which we want them used (i.e. SANG) rather than use the Trojan horse technique which lacks transparency and risks failure.

Natural England have also endorsed (as did Claire) the possibility of the FNP having a "brownfield first" policy so I would really like to discuss this further with you.

I look forward to hearing back from you and would still favour a joint approach where we can all agree Claire's report and get it finalised, allowing us to form and agree actions to move the Plan forward.

The most recent report to the Western Area Planning Committee (January 2016) can be seen here. This gives the current unallocated SANG capacity at Farnham Park as 315 dwellings.

With regard to consents granted since April 14, I can give you the following information:

As of 1/4/15, there were outstanding planning permissions for 1,704 homes (net) across Waverley. As of 1/10/15, there were 1,737 homes with an outstanding permission, with 270 more approved subject to a legal agreement. This is taken from the <u>Five Year Land Supply statement 1/10/15</u>. If this is not the information you need, please let me know and I will see if Annie Reid, who monitors housing permissions and completions, can help you.

Finally, regarding your request to get together to discuss Clare's report, Cllr Cockburn recently requested a meeting on this matter with Matthew Evans and met with Matthew, myself and Gareth Evans last week (12 January). Did Cllr Cockburn not mention this to you? At the meeting, Matthew agreed to produce a letter setting out Waverley's position on the provision of SANG through the neighbourhood plan, in light of Clare's report. The broad approach we agreed is that the FNP would identify housing sites (with SANG provision demonstrated to be available) for the first 5 years but for longer term sites, SANG provision would be made through the Local Plan. The letter that is currently being drafted will explain this in more detail.

In reply to Clare's questions -

- (i) Waverley's only current SANG resource is that at Farnham Park. The notional area designated as SANG amounts to 25% of the total park area 21.25 ha. This acts as a strategic resource that is available to mitigate approved housing developments within 5 km of the TBH SPA.
- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed

an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently **1,348** dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's <u>Western Area Planning Committee</u>. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently **1,348** dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's <u>Western Area Planning Committee</u>. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

The most recent report to the Western Area Planning Committee (January 2016) can be seen here. This gives the current unallocated SANG capacity at Farnham Park as 315 dwellings.

With regard to consents granted since April 14, I can give you the following information:

As of 1/4/15, there were outstanding planning permissions for 1,704 homes (net) across Waverley. As of 1/10/15, there were 1,737 homes with an outstanding permission, with 270 more approved subject to a legal agreement. This is taken from the <u>Five Year Land Supply statement 1/10/15</u>. If this is not the information you need, please let me know and I will see if Annie Reid, who monitors housing permissions and completions, can help you.

Finally, regarding your request to get together to discuss Clare's report, Cllr Cockburn recently requested a meeting on this matter with Matthew Evans and met with Matthew, myself and Gareth Evans last week (12 January). Did Cllr Cockburn not mention this to you? At the meeting, Matthew agreed to produce a letter setting out Waverley's position on the provision of SANG through the neighbourhood plan, in light of Clare's report. Thanks for your email, which I have forwarded to and discussed with Matthew. This response is based on this discussion.

Our view on Clare's report is that whilst it perhaps overcomplicates things and is not as useful as we hoped, we are not proposing to request any changes to it. We intend to use it as a background paper but with no status.

With regard to Marc's comments, we do not consider that too much weight should be given to his comment about not supporting the FNP unless it contains 'lines on maps' with 'preferred solutions'. His comments related to a local plan examination at Rushmoor and there is a big difference between a neighbourhood plan and a local plan.

We note your comment that the FNP is unlikely to allocate SANG as Local Greenspace, as the sites being considered would not meet the criteria for LGS set in the NPPF.

Regarding the 'brownfield first' approach, NE and Clare both agree this is possible, but only if endorsed by WBC. Our position is very clear on this, as set out in Matthew's letter.

Matthew does not consider that there would be any benefit in a further meeting at this stage. The letter sets out our position clearly and we are not sure what else we can discuss.

Yes I know Carole met with you both last week but my understand was that this wasn't in an FTC capacity. This is why there wasn't an FTC officer at the meeting. I think she really wanted an update as a member on what WBC is doing and sees itself doin following Claire's report and the work you are doing with Farnham Park capacity.

As you know, Carole can't as a single member, agree the Town Council's strategy or position. I would think we would also need to ensure Natural England are on board with the approach we all agree on too before we set anything in stone.

In the note I gave Carole to pass on to you (I hope she left you with a copy – but have pasted some if the text below just in case) I highlighted NE's initial observations on the report.

In the short term I feel that we need to agree what further clarity we wish to seek from Claire's report in order to have it finalised so that it can be used to help us make decisions and be made public. At the moment it doesn't offer much certainty and points out that there is a divergence of opinion, which we all knew but were seeking to clarify.

Regarding Natural England's endorsement of our joint approach, I provided Marc Turner at NE with some excerpts from the report and his observations were (I did not send him a full copy as I felt it wasn't appropriate whilst in draft form). I provided the below points for comment:

- A "brownfield first" for SANGS sites such as Farnham Park, policy in the FNP is possible but would need to be endorsed by WBC and Natural England.
- The wording of a policy that sets out the mitigation requirements which affect development within the zone of influence should reflect accurately the wording of the draft Local Plan policy.
- The FNP may allocate sites and rely on the current Supplementary Planning Document and emerging Local Plan to allocate SANGS, in order to provide certainty and clarity to developers and this facilitate development.
- A project based approach may be the most suitable to the FNP in identifying SANGS. This would be in the form of a "working note", jointly undertaken by WBC and FTC and would set out how SANGS will be managed and allocated in the FNP area, in order to satisfy an examiner that the site allocations in the FNP are deliverable and sustainable.

Marc's response:

I definitely agree with the first 3 bullet points, the 4th maybe needs a little clarification. I have no issues with the project approach; we will just need to be certain there is enough SANG coming forward for the sites allocated in FNP, at the plan stage. So the plan may say it is allocating 2000 homes, so we will need to see where the 38ha will be the SANG. The Inspector for the Rushmoor Local Plan, wanted to see lines on maps and SANGs identified. They did have a slightly dodgy TBH policy, which through the examination we got tightened up. I think we would need to see lines on maps outlining where "the preferred SANG solution" will go, along with policy wording in line with all other TBH Policy. If when it comes to the crunch different SANGs are put forward, we will be happy as long as they fit the bill.

So as far as I can tell, the assumption at the moment is that the FNP can rely on the LP for to deliver SANGs. However, Clare's report is unclear as to how this is acceptable in practice – i.e. what we need to do to prove it to an examiner. Further questions need to be agreed and put to Clare before her report is finalised. Most importantly, from what Marc has said now and in previous meetings, NE will not support the FNP unless there are lines on maps illustrating "preferred solutions".

Also to clarify, as I have had the opportunity to read the helpful letter from Matthew and discussed the report with Tony, the Town Council are unlikely to follow the route of allocating possible SANG solutions as LGS as the areas we were/are considering for SANG are not particularly beautiful, of historic significance, or of recreational value (including as a playing field), tranquillity or richness of wildlife. It may also be argued that, in order to meet the NE minimum size, they are extensive tracts of land. If the NP Examiner considers our SANG sites fail to pass the above tests as Local Open Space (rather than those for SANG) we would be left with no SANG to support the NP – which would then be undeliverable. It would seem preferable and less risky to allocate sites for which we want them used (i.e. SANG) rather than use the Trojan horse technique which lacks transparency and risks failure.

Natural England have also endorsed (as did Claire) the possibility of the FNP having a "brownfield first" policy so I would really like to discuss this further with you.

I look forward to hearing back from you and would still favour a joint approach where we can all agree Claire's report and get it finalised, allowing us to form and agree actions to move the Plan forward.

The broad approach we agreed is that the FNP would identify housing sites (with SANG provision demonstrated to be available) for the first 5 years but for longer term sites, SANG provision would be made through the Local Plan. The letter that is currently being drafted will explain this in more detail.

In reply to Clare's questions –

- (i) Waverley's only current SANG resource is that at Farnham Park. The notional area designated as SANG amounts to 25% of the total park area 21.25 ha. This acts as a strategic resource that is available to mitigate approved housing developments within 5 km of the TBH SPA.
- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's

capacity is currently **1,348** dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's <u>Western Area Planning Committee</u>. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

Thank you for getting back to me.

Whilst I respect your position am slightly disappointed at the apparent desire to not work together on this.

The meeting with Claire very encouraging, especially the openness on all sides to embrace the opportunity to share, be transparent and come to a mutual agreement which allows the progression of the FNP and the LP in the most appropriate timescale for the benefit of local people.

I would suggest that if you have a difference of opinion to NE, that this should be discussed in detail. Without an open debate following the report, it is incredibly difficult to move forward. Claire's report is clear on the fact that we need to ensure our approach is

supported by NE and so discussion with them is key to agreeing a solution or approach. Would you not agree with this? I would point out that we were not assuming any weight to what Marc Turner has said, especially in comparing us to Rushmoor which we would also question, but I was simply sharing the feedback with you to help our conversation and highlighted that it was his initial feedback. I had hoped that you had a view on his comments which would reflect ours and I could send a joint response for further clarification.

If Waverley has formed a view on the report I would suggest that this be communicated to Farnham Town Council appropriately. The letter to Councillor Cockburn (as a Borough Councillor) is not a formal response to the Town Council – this communication should be sent to the Town Clerk. The Town Council has agreed, on receipt of the report, to defer deciding on an approach before having detailed discussions with yourselves and Natural England so that the approach we take is something all parties agree on.

It would be a shame if we cannot continue the positive relationship that was present at the meeting with Claire, where we all agreed that we needed to communicate and work together to get the NP to the next stage.

In relation to Clare's draft report, I don't see that we can admit that it over complicates the situation, yet not provide the opportunity for it to be clarified. It would seem a waste of resources to sign the report off as complete, whilst acknowledging that it does not serve the purpose of the initial brief. If Waverley does not wish to progress this with NPIERS jointly with Farnham Town Council, then the Town Council will need to consider if it should clarify any outstanding matters with Claire directly.

Thanks for your email, which I have forwarded to and discussed with Matthew. This response is based on this discussion.

Our view on Clare's report is that whilst it perhaps overcomplicates things and is not as useful as we hoped, we are not proposing to request any changes to it. We intend to use it as a background paper but with no status.

With regard to Marc's comments, we do not consider that too much weight should be given to his comment about not supporting the FNP unless it contains 'lines on maps' with 'preferred solutions'. His comments related to a local plan examination at Rushmoor and there is a big difference between a neighbourhood plan and a local plan.

We note your comment that the FNP is unlikely to allocate SANG as Local Greenspace, as the sites being considered would not meet the criteria for LGS set in the NPPF.

Regarding the 'brownfield first' approach, NE and Clare both agree this is possible, but only if endorsed by WBC. Our position is very clear on this, as set out in Matthew's letter.

Matthew does not consider that there would be any benefit in a further meeting at this stage. The letter sets out our position clearly and we are not sure what else we can discuss.

Yes I know Carole met with you both last week but my understand was that this wasn't in an FTC capacity. This is why there wasn't an FTC officer at the meeting. I think she really wanted an update as a member on what WBC is doing and sees itself doin following Claire's report and the work you are doing with Farnham Park capacity.

As you know, Carole can't as a single member, agree the Town Council's strategy or position. I would think we would also need to ensure Natural England are on board with the approach we all agree on too before we set anything in stone.

In the note I gave Carole to pass on to you (I hope she left you with a copy – but have pasted some if the text below just in case) I highlighted NE's initial observations on the report.

In the short term I feel that we need to agree what further clarity we wish to seek from Claire's report in order to have it finalised so that it can be used to help us make decisions and be made public. At the moment it doesn't offer much certainty and points out that there is a divergence of opinion, which we all knew but were seeking to clarify.

Regarding Natural England's endorsement of our joint approach, I provided Marc Turner at NE with some excerpts from the report and his observations were (I did not send him a full copy as I felt it wasn't appropriate whilst in draft form). I provided the below points for comment:

• A "brownfield first" for SANGS sites such as Farnham Park, policy in the FNP is possible but would need to be endorsed by WBC and Natural England.

- The wording of a policy that sets out the mitigation requirements which affect development within the zone of influence should reflect accurately the wording of the draft Local Plan policy.
- The FNP may allocate sites and rely on the current Supplementary Planning Document and emerging Local Plan to allocate SANGS, in order to provide certainty and clarity to developers and this facilitate development.
- A project based approach may be the most suitable to the FNP in identifying SANGS. This would be in the form of a "working note", jointly undertaken by WBC and FTC and would set out how SANGS will be managed and allocated in the FNP area, in order to satisfy an examiner that the site allocations in the FNP are deliverable and sustainable.

Marc's response:

I definitely agree with the first 3 bullet points, the 4th maybe needs a little clarification. I have no issues with the project approach; we will just need to be certain there is enough SANG coming forward for the sites allocated in FNP, at the plan stage. So the plan may say it is allocating 2000 homes, so we will need to see where the 38ha will be the SANG. The Inspector for the Rushmoor Local Plan, wanted to see lines on maps and SANGs identified. They did have a slightly dodgy TBH policy, which through the examination we got tightened up. I think we would need to see lines on maps outlining where "the preferred SANG solution" will go, along with policy wording in line with all other TBH Policy. If when it comes to the crunch different SANGs are put forward, we will be happy as long as they fit the bill.

So as far as I can tell, the assumption at the moment is that the FNP can rely on the LP for to deliver SANGs. However, Clare's report is unclear as to how this is acceptable in practice – i.e. what we need to do to prove it to an examiner. Further questions need to be agreed and put to Clare before her report is finalised. Most importantly, from what Marc has said now and in previous meetings, NE will not support the FNP unless there are lines on maps illustrating "preferred solutions".

Also to clarify, as I have had the opportunity to read the helpful letter from Matthew and discussed the report with Tony, the Town Council are unlikely to follow the route of allocating possible SANG solutions as LGS as the areas we were/are considering for SANG are not particularly beautiful, of historic significance, or of recreational value (including as a playing field), tranquillity or richness of wildlife. It may also be argued that, in order to meet the NE minimum size, they are extensive tracts of land. If the NP Examiner considers our SANG sites fail to pass the above tests as Local Open Space (rather than those for SANG) we would be left with no SANG to support the NP – which would then be undeliverable. It would seem preferable and less risky to allocate sites for which we want them used (i.e. SANG) rather than use the Trojan horse technique which lacks transparency and risks failure.

Natural England have also endorsed (as did Claire) the possibility of the FNP having a "brownfield first" policy so I would really like to discuss this further with you.

I look forward to hearing back from you and would still favour a joint approach where we can all agree Claire's report and get it finalised, allowing us to form and agree actions to move the Plan forward.

The most recent report to the Western Area Planning Committee (January 2016) can be seen here. This gives the current unallocated SANG capacity at Farnham Park as 315 dwellings.

With regard to consents granted since April 14, I can give you the following information:

As of 1/4/15, there were outstanding planning permissions for 1,704 homes (net) across Waverley. As of 1/10/15, there were 1,737 homes with an outstanding permission, with 270 more approved subject to a legal agreement. This is taken from the <u>Five Year Land Supply statement 1/10/15</u>. If this is not the information you need, please let me know and I will see if Annie Reid, who monitors housing permissions and completions, can help you.

Finally, regarding your request to get together to discuss Clare's report, Cllr Cockburn recently requested a meeting on this matter with Matthew Evans and met with Matthew, myself and Gareth Evans last week (12 January). Did Cllr Cockburn not mention this to you? At the meeting, Matthew agreed to produce a letter setting out Waverley's position on the provision of SANG through the neighbourhood plan, in light of Clare's report. The broad approach we agreed is that the FNP would identify housing sites (with SANG provision demonstrated to be available) for the first 5 years but for longer term sites, SANG provision would be made through the Local Plan. The letter that is currently being drafted will explain this in more detail.

In reply to Clare's questions -

- (i) Waverley's only current SANG resource is that at Farnham Park. The notional area designated as SANG amounts to 25% of the total park area 21.25 ha. This acts as a strategic resource that is available to mitigate approved housing developments within 5 km of the TBH SPA.
- (ii) The capacity of the SANG (numbers of dwellings) was originally set using the SPA Delivery Framework formula of 8 ha of SANG per 1000 new residents. This assumed an average occupancy rate of 2.4 persons per dwelling (ppd), but monitoring of planning permissions in this part of the borough has shown an achieved occupancy rate of 1.97 ppd. Applying this rate in the SANG conversion formula, the park's capacity is currently **1,348** dwellings. The take-up of that capacity is constantly monitored and updates are reported to all meetings of the council's <u>Western Area Planning Committee</u>. The latest report (November 2015) showed a remaining (unallocated) capacity of 331 dwellings (excluding pending applications and appeals).

Thank you for getting back to me.

Whilst I respect your position am slightly disappointed at the apparent desire to not work together on this.

The meeting with Claire very encouraging, especially the openness on all sides to embrace the opportunity to share, be transparent and come to a mutual agreement which allows the progression of the FNP and the LP in the most appropriate timescale for the benefit of local people.

I would suggest that if you have a difference of opinion to NE, that this should be discussed in detail. Without an open debate following the report, it is incredibly difficult to move forward. Claire's report is clear on the fact that we need to ensure our approach is supported by NE and so discussion with them is key to agreeing a solution or approach. Would you not agree with this? I would point out that we were not assuming any weight to what Marc Turner has said, especially in comparing us to Rushmoor which we would also question, but I was simply sharing the feedback with you to help our conversation and highlighted that it was his initial feedback. I had hoped that you had a view on his comments which would reflect ours and I could send a joint response for further clarification.

If Waverley has formed a view on the report I would suggest that this be communicated to Farnham Town Council appropriately. The letter to Councillor Cockburn (as a Borough Councillor) is not a formal response to the Town Council – this communication should be sent to the Town Clerk. The Town Council has agreed, on receipt of the report, to defer deciding on an approach before having detailed discussions with yourselves and Natural England so that the approach we take is something all parties agree on.

It would be a shame if we cannot continue the positive relationship that was present at the meeting with Claire, where we all agreed that we needed to communicate and work together to get the NP to the next stage.

In relation to Clare's draft report, I don't see that we can admit that it over complicates the situation, yet not provide the opportunity for it to be clarified. It would seem a waste of resources to sign the report off as complete, whilst acknowledging that it does not serve the purpose of the initial brief. If Waverley does not wish to progress this with NPIERS jointly with Farnham Town Council, then the Town Council will need to consider if it should clarify any outstanding matters with Claire directly.

Thanks for your email, which I have forwarded to and discussed with Matthew. This response is based on this discussion.

Our view on Clare's report is that whilst it perhaps overcomplicates things and is not as useful as we hoped, we are not proposing to request any changes to it. We intend to use it as a background paper but with no status.

With regard to Marc's comments, we do not consider that too much weight should be given to his comment about not supporting the FNP unless it contains 'lines on maps' with 'preferred solutions'. His comments related to a local plan examination at Rushmoor and there is a big difference between a neighbourhood plan and a local plan.

We note your comment that the FNP is unlikely to allocate SANG as Local Greenspace, as the sites being considered would not meet the criteria for LGS set in the NPPF.

Regarding the 'brownfield first' approach, NE and Clare both agree this is possible, but only if endorsed by WBC. Our position is very clear on this, as set out in Matthew's letter.

Matthew does not consider that there would be any benefit in a further meeting at this stage. The letter sets out our position clearly and we are not sure what else we can discuss.

Yes I know Carole met with you both last week but my understand was that this wasn't in an FTC capacity. This is why there wasn't an FTC officer at the meeting. I think she really wanted an update as a member on what WBC is doing and sees itself doin following Claire's report and the work you are doing with Farnham Park capacity.

As you know, Carole can't as a single member, agree the Town Council's strategy or position. I would think we would also need to ensure Natural England are on board with the approach we all agree on too before we set anything in stone.

In the note I gave Carole to pass on to you (I hope she left you with a copy – but have pasted some if the text below just in case) I highlighted NE's initial observations on the report.

In the short term I feel that we need to agree what further clarity we wish to seek from Claire's report in order to have it finalised so that it can be used to help us make decisions and be made public. At the moment it doesn't offer much certainty and points out that there is a divergence of opinion, which we all knew but were seeking to clarify.

Regarding Natural England's endorsement of our joint approach, I provided Marc Turner at NE with some excerpts from the report and his observations were (I did not send him a full copy as I felt it wasn't appropriate whilst in draft form). I provided the below points for comment:

- A "brownfield first" for SANGS sites such as Farnham Park, policy in the FNP is possible but would need to be endorsed by WBC and Natural England.
- The wording of a policy that sets out the mitigation requirements which affect development within the zone of influence should reflect accurately the wording of the draft Local Plan policy.
- The FNP may allocate sites and rely on the current Supplementary Planning Document and emerging Local Plan to allocate SANGS, in order to provide certainty and clarity to developers and this facilitate development.
- A project based approach may be the most suitable to the FNP in identifying SANGS. This would be in the form of a "working note", jointly undertaken by WBC and FTC and would set out how SANGS will be managed and allocated in the FNP area, in order to satisfy an examiner that the site allocations in the FNP are deliverable and sustainable.

Marc's response:

I definitely agree with the first 3 bullet points, the 4th maybe needs a little clarification. I have no issues with the project approach; we will just need to be certain there is enough SANG coming forward for the sites allocated in FNP, at the plan stage. So the plan may say it is allocating 2000 homes, so we will need to see where the 38ha will be the SANG. The Inspector for the Rushmoor Local Plan, wanted to see lines on maps and SANGs identified. They did have a slightly dodgy TBH policy, which through the examination we got tightened up. I think we would need to see lines on maps outlining where "the preferred SANG solution" will go, along with policy wording in line with all other TBH Policy. If when it comes to the crunch different SANGs are put forward, we will be happy as long as they fit the bill.

So as far as I can tell, the assumption at the moment is that the FNP can rely on the LP for to deliver SANGs. However, Clare's report is unclear as to how this is acceptable in practice – i.e. what we need to do to prove it to an examiner. Further questions need to be agreed and put to Clare before her report is finalised. Most importantly, from what Marc has said now and in previous meetings, NE will not support the FNP unless there are lines on maps illustrating "preferred solutions".

Also to clarify, as I have had the opportunity to read the helpful letter from Matthew and discussed the report with Tony, the Town Council are unlikely to follow the route of allocating possible SANG solutions as LGS as the areas we were/are considering for SANG are not particularly beautiful, of historic significance, or of recreational value (including as a playing field), tranquillity or richness of wildlife. It may also be argued that, in order to meet the NE minimum size, they are extensive tracts of land. If the NP Examiner considers our

SANG sites fail to pass the above tests as Local Open Space (rather than those for SANG) we would be left with no SANG to support the NP – which would then be undeliverable. It would seem preferable and less risky to allocate sites for which we want them used (i.e. SANG) rather than use the Trojan horse technique which lacks transparency and risks failure.

Natural England have also endorsed (as did Claire) the possibility of the FNP having a "brownfield first" policy so I would really like to discuss this further with you.

I look forward to hearing back from you and would still favour a joint approach where we can all agree Claire's report and get it finalised, allowing us to form and agree actions to move the Plan forward.

The most recent report to the Western Area Planning Committee (January 2016) can be seen here. This gives the current unallocated SANG capacity at Farnham Park as 315 dwellings.

With regard to consents granted since April 14, I can give you the following information:

As of 1/4/15, there were outstanding planning permissions for 1,704 homes (net) across Waverley. As of 1/10/15, there were 1,737 homes with an outstanding permission, with 270 more approved subject to a legal agreement. This is taken from the <u>Five Year Land Supply statement 1/10/15</u>. If this is not the information you need, please let me know and I will see if Annie Reid, who monitors housing permissions and completions, can help you.

Finally, regarding your request to get together to discuss Clare's report, Cllr Cockburn recently requested a meeting on this matter with Matthew Evans and met with Matthew, myself and Gareth Evans last week (12 January). Did Cllr Cockburn not mention this to you? At the meeting, Matthew agreed to produce a letter setting out Waverley's position on the provision of SANG through the neighbourhood plan, in light of Clare's report. The broad approach we agreed is that the FNP would identify housing sites (with SANG provision demonstrated to be available) for the first 5 years but for longer term sites, SANG provision would be made through the Local Plan. The letter that is currently being drafted will explain this in more detail.
