#### New playground and toilets for Gostrey Meadow

A project is underway to refurbish the playground and toilets at Gostrey Meadow.

In September, Farnham Town Council surveyed parents/ carers and young people to find out what they would like to see in the new playground.

The next stage is to invite playground suppliers to put forward costed proposals that incorporate people's ideas. Once the tenders have been analysed and shortlisted, there will be a further consultation where people will be invited to comment on the designs.

The final plan is subject to planning permission, but it is hoped that a new playground will be installed for Farnham's young people by 2026.

# Supporting younger people

Farnham Town Council has delivered on its promise to improve its support for younger people this year.

An extra £90,000 has also been invested in strengthening the outreach work that already exists for younger people from existing organisations such as 40 Degreez, Hale Community and Youth Centre and the Jubilee Hub in Wrecclesham.

# Younger people's holiday activities

This year, Farnham Town Council has awarded grants of £20,000 to organisations in Farnham to help fund free school holiday activities for younger people of all ages, especially those that may be financially disadvantaged.

Over the summer, younger people were able to take part in creative activities, games, sport, baking, singing, drama and outings to the seaside and Alice Holt.

#### Farnham Lantern Festival



October Craft Month will draw to a close with Farnham's first Lantern Festival on Thursday 31 October.

The inspiration for the Festival is the celebration which marks the end of the harvest season and the beginning of winter, taking stock of the past and looking forward to the future.

Over the summer, community groups, faith groups, schools and informal groups of friends have been expressing their creativity by making spectacular willow and paper lanterns.

On 31 October at 6pm, there will be an outdoor gathering at Gostrey Meadow when the community will come together to light up the dark October evening with their lanterns. The aim is to create a gentle festival atmosphere on the last day of October Craft Month. The group will walk with their lanterns to St Andrew's Church, where the lanterns will be displayed as a largescale communal craft endeavour.
